BIBLE READING

Read the Bible texts using different translations or ageappropriate children's Bibles, act it out, use puppets or visual aids.

ACTIVITIES

- His Glory Appears-Sit together under a large thick blanket or each person under their own thick blanket. Talk about what it's like sitting in darkness. Then, turn bright lights on and come out from under the blanket(s). Now, talk about what it's like going from darkness into bright light. How is this picture like what the Lord does for us?
- You May Come-What does it mean to have access to something? You can get to them. Usually more important things, we limit access to. But God, has given us full access to Him. He invites us to approach Him full of confidence that He will hear us and answer us. Pray to Him now in that confidence. s
- 3. **Follow that Star**-Create a star. Then, parade it through the house, with all of you following it as you go. Talk about how the magi followed the star to lead them to the Christ child. What do you think compelled them to follow the star? What points you to Jesus?

DISCUSSION

- 1. Share highs and lows of the day.

- 6. What do you learn about the key theme? How can you apply it to your daily walk with the Lord? (Yourself, your relationship with God or your relationships with others?)
- 7. Any cautions to heed? Any promises to anticipate?

PRAYER

- Adoration (Wow, God!): Proclaim at least three things that amaze you about God today.
- Confession (Sorry, God!): Confess, repent, and ask for forgiveness.
- **Thanksgiving (Thanks, God!):** Thank God for blessings, lessons, gifts, etc.
- Supplication (Please, God!): Ask God to intervene where you know of needs.
