BIBLE READING

Read the Bible texts using different translations or ageappropriate children's Bibles, act it out, use puppets or visual aids.

- 7echariah 9:9-12
- Psalm 118:19-29
- Philippians 2:5-11
- John 12:12-19

Memorize

SINGING

- "Hosanna Loud Hosanna" (Lutheran Service Book 443)

ACTIVITIES

- Holy Week Bingo-Each person create a 4x4 grid on a piece of paper and put the following prompts in a random order on your grid to create a bingo board. (Not every item will fit on each person's board but that's how bingo is.) 1) palm, 2) hosanna, 3) donkey, 4) Passover/Lord's Supper, 5) prayer, 6) sleep, 7) 30 pieces of silver, 8) ear & sword, 9) arrest, 10) trial, 11) rooster, 12) whip, 13) crown of thorns, 14) cross, 15) 3 nails, 16) dice/cast lots, 17) vinegar, 18) soldier, 19) spear, 20) tomb, 21) spices/perfumes, 22) angel. Write all of these prompts down on slips of paper and then play bingo using the boards made.
- 2. **Hosanna**-Make a "hosanna" banner to hang in your home. Talk about what hosanna means (God save us!). Then talk about how things moved from people shouting "Hosanna" to "Crucify Him!" in a few days' time.

Q & A: Assign one person to be the catechizer to ask questions and allow others to answer. (Guide them/provide unknown answers.)

DISCUSSION

- 1. Share highs and lows of the day.
- 2. How have you seen God at work lately?
- 3. What does the Scripture reading teach about God?
- 4. What does it teach about people?
- 5. What is the key theme of the Scripture reading?
- 6. What do you learn about the key theme? How can you apply it to your daily walk with the Lord? (Yourself, your relationship with God or your relationships with others?)
- 7. Any cautions to heed? Any promises to anticipate?

PRAYER

- Adoration (Wow, God!): Proclaim at least three things that amaze you about God today.
- Confession (Sorry, God!): Confess, repent, and ask for forgiveness.
- **Thanksgiving (Thanks, God!):** Thank God for blessings, lessons, gifts, etc.
- **Supplication (Please, God!):** Ask God to intervene where you know of needs.
