Once again, proceeds from the sale




went to support Water Mission ministry, which helps provide for sanitation



NEEDED AND GIVEN



When our wonderful editor let us know the prompt for this month's newsletter, I had a two-pronged response. First, was, "Oh, one of my most favorite topics." But as I began to consider just how to approach it for this format, I had another response: "Ugh! To admit loving God's mercy, there must come a confession. And one which attempts, at least, to fit the love of the subject so stated."

Mercy is a most blessed topic. But to truly love it, one must have not only experienced it but have embraced it. And there are no half measures in mercy. No bits and pieces. It's all or nothing. And that's where my second response becomes a challenge. To love mercy, to truly love it, one needs to grapple and own the fact that one needs it. And not some namby-pamby kind of need, but full-throated and dire need. And I do.

Be honest. Please be honest with yourself on this front. Is there a day, or any part of any day, where you don't see your great need of God's sweet mercy? Mercy is that divine withholding from us what we most certainly deserve. And what we deserve is beyond any help, save that which is offered in Jesus.

I had a wonderful seminary professor who used to say to us, "There is no prayer which our Lord loves to hear more from His children than this, "Lord, have mercy." Really? I used to think.



With all I could speak to the God of the universe about, with all I could ask from Him, His favorite request to hear is, "Have mercy, Lord?" I still think of that often. And I'm glad that I do.

I am a great "user" of that prayer. And I have found its sweetness to be without qualification. I'm not proud that I *need* to voice the prayer as much as I do. And I also pray that I will need to less. But how I relish that I have learned of God's mercy, its source, and its availability.

The great and ancient "Jesus Prayer" is a great way to make this need rise to the surface of our thoughts each day. Do you know it? It goes like this: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner." It's also wonderful to pray it with plural pronouns to cover our forever family. If it isn't a part of your practice, perhaps that is a good addition to the conversations you have with our Father. Remember, it's something He loves to hear. From you.
