Pastor's Corner for August 6-12

Eternal Perspective

Romans chapter 8 may be my favorite chapter in the whole Bible. If you haven't read it before, or it's been a while, stop right now, pick up your Bible, and read through it. Isn't it such a great chapter! In this one chapter, we get to see the entirety of God's salvation plan. It's all right here in one single chapter. We see the work of the Trinity; the sending of the Son, the work of the Spirit, and the relationship with the Father. As they work together as one God, it is all for one purpose... to give us a place in eternity. That is God's goal, that is why the Son came to earth, that is why the Spirit lives within us now, that's why the Father choses to call us His children. It's all about the saving grace that leads to life eternal.

So, if the whole chapter focuses on what God has done for us in eternity, then why does this life even matter? If the whole chapter, and really all of God's salvation plan is focused on God's desire to give us a heavenly home, then why concern ourselves with what goes on in our lives here on earth? Do we separate our earthly lives and our eternal lives too much?

And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to His purpose. (Romans 8:28)

This may be one of the most well-known verses in the Bible, and for good reason. This verse can bring great strength to the believer, but only when read well. If we don't read the verse well, then the verse can lead us into despair. It can cause us to doubt the strength and love of God if we are not careful how we read this verse.

What this verse is doing is connecting our earthly and eternal lives, giving us an eternal perspective. Hearing the words, "all things work together for good" can cause us to wonder about the troubles (understatement!) that we face in this life and the troubles that God's people have always faced in this life. It doesn't always look like much good is going on! Paul isn't telling us that bad things won't happen to God's people. Quite the opposite actually. Here, Paul is echoing the words of Joseph, speaking to jealously treacherous brothers in Genesis 50:20, "As for you, you meant evil against me and God meant it for good."

It's all about the eternal perspective that God gives us in this life. We certainly will face troubles in this life (Rm. 8:18), but when they come up, how do we respond. Do we become angry, fearful, depressed, or stressed, or do we look at the situation with an eternal perspective, knowing that God has our place in heaven already prepared. This doesn't give us permission to be lazy or overly carefree, but it does give us permission to trust that God is in charge and working in you today.

This is one of our goals in our confirmation classes, giving our students an eternal perspective. Looking at the stories of Scripture that are part of our story, the way that God has led people like Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, David, Paul, Peter, and John through this life with an eternal perspective can aid us in our lives






The Veterans Group at RLC


