Pastor's Corner for October 15-21

Where do you find peace?

Is there a place that you go, an activity that you partake in that brings you peace? It's my prayer that we all have somewhere we can go or something we can do that brings us peace. It's something that gives us the opportunity to rest and recharge.

Fall is a time of year that I get the opportunity to rest and find peace. It's not the cooler weather or the rainy days, it's not the football season or the apple cider (though all those things do help!). No, it's deer season. Deer hunting has long been a tradition in my family, and I am blessed to have the opportunity to continue the sport in North Carolina. But it isn't just about the opportunity to fill the freezer (I

am not a good hunter...) it's about the peace found in being in God's Creation. It is a time that is set aside with no distractions where I can talk with my Father God in the peace and quiet of the woods. There's no cell reception, no noise, no work, no expectations; just the simplicity of sitting in creation and soaking in the peacefulness found there.

Where does God give you a place of peace? In the midst of crazy schedules, screaming kids, louder news, busy streets, and overwhelming work, do you find a time or place to rest and recharge? God was really big on peace. In fact, He found it so important to His people that it is a guaranteed gift from our Creator God to His people.

And the peace of God, which passes all understanding,
will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (Phil. 4:7)

This peace is what God does for you, His gift for you! Just like God's forgiveness, grace, mercy, compassion, and love, His peace is something that we can only freely receive. It isn't a feeling or an emotion, it is a state of being, a part of our identity as children of our Father God.

Because the peace of God is something that we always have, it is something that we can always look toward. In the times that we don't have time to stop and rest, we can think on the peace that God has given to us (Phil. 4:8) and we can think on what that peace has done for us. It is the guarantee of God's promise to His people. A promise that "the Lord God will wipe away tears from all faces, that the reproach of His people He will take away from all the earth" (Is. 25:8). This is who your God is for you. This is who our Creator God is for the whole world!

It is my prayer that you find sometime this week to find a peaceful place to rest, but more than that, it is my prayer that you think on the peace that God has won for you, that He has given to you, that you have now and always.

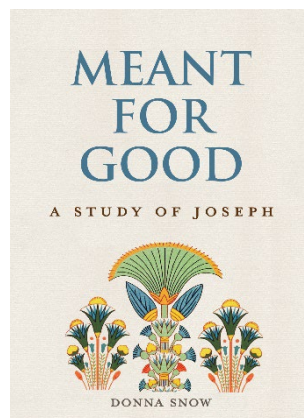

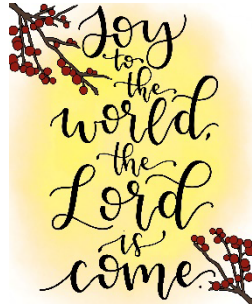

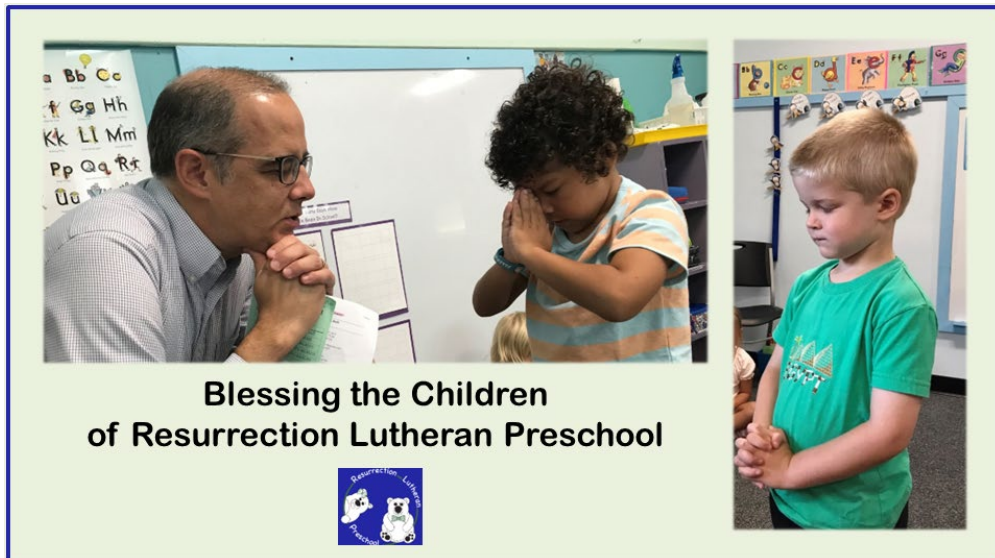
