
Christ the King November 19, 2023



Pastor's Corner for November 19-25

The Last Battle (1 Corinthians 15:10-28)

The fact of Jesus of Nazareth crucified and risen from the dead so thoroughly impacted the course of human history that we shouldn't be surprised to hear echoes of that story or see its "ripples" throughout our art and literature... like the impact of a meteor on an otherwise calm and placid ocean. Such an impact might occur even when the creators of such art never intended them to be there in the first place. The enthronement of the King of Glory on the cross of Calvary amidst the wreckage of life just can't help but show up in unexpected places.

That thought crossed my mind the first time I saw the movie Hacksaw Ridge several years back. (After six years of living in Okinawa, Japan, I find that movie has left a special place in my heart ever since.) The depiction of Desmond Doss at the Battle of Okinawa has echoes of "Christ the King" reverberating inside of it. That's not only because Doss was a real Christian man, desiring to serve his country during World War II as one who would save life rather than take it. It is the fact that Doss was, by all appearances, NOT a hero. He was slight of stature. His refusal to take up weapons in battle or even retaliate when picked upon appeared cowardly. The men of his company viewed him at first (not unjustifiably) as a liability. But Doss would

demonstrate his mettle on the battlefield. Even after his fellow-soldiers had retreated from the killing zone, Doss, a medic, would keep going back into the hellish place to "get one more" of the wounded. The day would come when they would not return to the heat of battle without him. Doss is not Jesus, of course. Yet the fact of the crucified and risen Jesus Christ has so impacted our world it is tempting to see the echo of Christ the King in the telling of Doss's story. God used Desmond Doss in an extraordinary way to bring life to many of the fallen on the battlefield.

This weekend we celebrate Christ, our King. The wreckage of life need not be a real battlefield. Our enemy the Devil is real. At times, suffering in the heat of conflict takes even the strongest of us by surprise. Yet Jesus, the King of Glory, is victorious over all that would overwhelm us and try to rob the outcome of Jesus' victory from us. St. Paul promises that, because of what Christ our King has accomplished, the Day is coming when even DEATH will be destroyed! Desmond Doss did not give up his own life for those he rescued. Jesus DID. And He did it for you and me. For all who look to the one-and-only King saying "Remember me when You come into Your kingdom," the answer comes: "You will be with me in Paradise. Today." As we close out the Church Year and gather together this Thanksgiving let us never forget: There is life for everyone on the battlefield of life. Even today. Even now. Thanks be to God!

Opportunity Scholarship Makes Tuition at Resurrection Lutheran School Even More Affordable

The 2023 Appropriations Act recently expanded access to the North Carolina Opportunity Scholarship. This means the cost of an education at schools like our very own Resurrection Lutheran School is more within reach than ever before.


Changes for the 2024-2025 school year include:

- Removal of the income cap for families to receive the scholarship; now all North Carolina students in kindergarten through 12th grade will be eligible for the Scholarship regardless of income.
- Prior public-school enrollment is no longer a requirement for eligibility for the scholarship.
- A student's scholarship amount will be based on household income.
- Scholarship amounts will range from approximately \$3,000 to approximately \$7,000.

Application for the scholarship for the 2024-2025 school year will open on February 1, 2024. Families must apply by March 1 to receive priority consideration. 
Mites for Missions


For Women of RLC and Their Guests,
