Pastor's Corner for April 14-20, 2024

"I saw Jesus!" (Luke 24:39-49)

What would you do if Jesus just showed up in your home unannounced? What questions would you ask Him? Would you offer Him something to eat? Maybe a drink? Would you show Him around the home? Jump for joy and embrace Him with a bear hug? Immediately apologize for the mess and start cleaning the house?

I imagine any of us would respond the same way the disciples did, "they were startled and frightened and thought they saw a spirit" (v. 37). I'm sure "startled and frightened" doesn't begin to describe their feelings! They were probably scared out of their wits! They saw Jesus die and the dead don't come back, but Jesus did and He keeps coming into our lives today. We might not see Jesus physically standing before us, asking for something to eat (v. 41) and hanging out for a while, but we do see Him. Our resurrected Savior is still showing up today to give us what we need.

Just this past week, I heard one of our preschoolers exclaim, “I saw Jesus in my playroom!” What incredible childlike joy! I have no idea what the kid actually saw, but Jesus was certainly there, present with him as he played at home. Have you seen Jesus in your playroom? In your kitchen? What about the dining room or garage? He is there, even if we don’t realize it and we can see Him.

Jesus tells the disciples that all of Scripture points to Him (v. 44). What that means for us is that all of Scripture shows us Jesus and shows us how He works. Anybody that we interact with, anybody that we serve, is a person that Jesus is working in (Matthew 25:40). Jesus is in the people that we don’t expect Him to be, working on their heart, opening them up to be served and to hear your resurrection witness (v. 48). As we serve and interact with others, we are serving and interacting with Jesus. As others interact and serve us, they are always serving and interacting with Jesus. When we live the resurrection towards others, it is not our work that we are bringing but Jesus’ work (v. 49). What an incredible privilege it is to work with Jesus in His Mission!

That is what church life is all about! Not doing anything new, rather it continues in God’s eternal salvation plan. This is what we are doing with **Time and Talent Weekend**. It is a small part of our participation with God in His salvation plan. God equips us through this gift of over 40 different opportunities to serve God by serving others. Many of them are simple actions that God uses to touch others in profound ways.

Where will you see Jesus this week? Maybe it’s in your playroom just like our preschooler. Wherever it may be, may we all serve well and seek opportunities to serve our resurrected Savior by serving others.

Responding to the Baltimore Bridge Collapse

On Tuesday, March 26, 2024, a cargo vessel collided with a support column of the Francis Scott Key Bridge in Baltimore MD causing it to collapse. Almost 32,000 cars per day traveled the 1.6 miles of this bridge which was part of the 695 Beltway.

We pray for God's mercy and comfort to surround the families of those who were on the bridge. It is a time of deep grief for each of them.
