Pastor's Corner for July 14-20, 2024

Before the Foundation of the Cosmos (Ephesians 1:3-14)

Today I heard something on the news as I drove to work about a marvel of God's creation I still don't fully understand. It's something called a "goldilocks black hole." Apparently, it was discovered a few years ago and just a few days ago was identified by the Hubble telescope in a star cluster some 17,000 light years away. This black hole is said to be of the "goldilocks" variety because it's neither the huge kind found at the center of galaxies, nor the small type formed by big stars that collapse in on themselves. It is just the right size to tantalize scientists who spend time envisioning how galaxies might have formed over time into what we know and experience today. It's estimated that something like 46,000 intermediate black holes exist in the vicinity of our Milky Way galaxy, alone. That's a lot to think about as I drive to church and prepare for one day of life lived on this speck of a planet spinning around one of 200 billion trillion stars we know exist in our "observable"

universe. I'm not sure I even want to try to think about how small we are when you add the "unobservable" reaches of space to that number!

Which is why it was good today to read God's promise in the opening verses of Ephesians 1 — our Epistle reading this weekend. As Paul writes his letter to the Ephesians, he takes a moment to reassure them. Our status as beloved children of God is not some accident. It did not originate with a divine afterthought. And it was certainly not the result of our own efforts! No, we were chosen, Paul writes, "before the foundation of the cosmos," that we might be holy and blameless before God. In LOVE God predestined us for adoption to himself through Christ Jesus. Imagine that. Before the spinning galaxies even started to whirl God had you and me in mind! That's how precious we are in God's eyes! It is also good to notice what St. Paul DOESN'T say. He doesn't say (or even imply) that God chooses some and rejects others. Humanity has always had the freedom and ability to do the wrong thing and walk away from its Creator and Redeemer. But the doctrine of predestination reassures us and astounds us when we wonder about what matters most to our God. The answer? You and me. It's as simple — it's as personal — as that.

So, no matter what your week looks like, no matter how small and insignificant your efforts today and tomorrow might appear to you... don't forget what happened before the foundation of the cosmos: God chose you! It all points to the faithfulness of our God who brought His own dear Son into our world and then brought Jesus to us, by His Spirit. It was all a part of the plan. It was all so that we, declared holy and blameless through Jesus, might reflect in some small measure the light of life the world still needs to see.

How will your ordinary day today look a little more extraordinary as a result?
