

Pastor's Corner for August 3-9, 2025

Eat, Drink, and Be Merry

Imagine you're in a crowd listening to Jesus say to not fear those who can kill the body, rather the One who has authority to cast into hell. And if you acknowledge Jesus before others, He will acknowledge you before the angels of God. Heavy topics, but then, out of nowhere, someone shouts out, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me." Umm... excuse me?

That's where we are in our gospel reading this week, and Jesus takes an opportunity to teach about keeping our priorities straight in the parable of the rich fool. Jesus tells of a rich man whose farmland produced more than he could store so he thought to himself, "tear it all down... build it back bigger and better. I'm set for life. Retirement, here I come. A trip to the Bahamas perhaps."

There is nothing wrong with working hard to save for retirement and provide for your family's future. But where is the rich man's focus? "And I will say to my soul, 'Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, and be merry." A Jewish listener may recognize the allusion to Ecclesiastes 8:15, "...for man has nothing better under the sun but to eat and drink and be joyful...".

But Jesus ties in another Old Testament verse as He continues the story: "Fool! This night your soul is required of you, and the things you have prepared, whose will they be?" If the Jewish listener is thinking about Ecclesiastes, they may recall chapter 2:18, "I hated all my toil in which I toil under the sun, seeing that I must leave it to the man who will come after me...". But Jesus may also be alluding to a much bigger message from Isaiah 22:13 as God speaks through Isaiah, calling them to repent and turn to God, warning them of Jerusalem's impending destruction and their captivity in Babylonian. But they refuse to repent and celebrate with feasts instead. Isaiah writes, "In that day the Lord God of hosts called for weeping and mourning, for baldness and wearing sackcloth; and behold, joy and gladness, killing oxen and slaughtering sheep, eating flesh and drinking wine. 'Let us eat and drink, for tomorrow we die'." Their focus was on themselves instead of God and they paid the price. The rich man's focus was on himself instead of God and he paid the price. Our focus is on the One who paid the price for us.

This week, we are encouraged in Paul's letter to the Colossians to keep setting our minds on the things above. In our pursuit of success and security, let us not lose sight of the greater treasure that awaits us in heaven. Let us be rich toward God by investing in our relationship with Him, serving others, and living out our faith. As we work hard and save for the future, let us remember that our true security and joy come from Jesus, who provides us with treasures that will never fade.

Associate Professor of
Exegetical Theology

Dr. Kevin Golden is associate professor of Exegetical Theology, dean of Theological Research and Publication, and director of Resident Field Education at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. He joined the faculty in 2021.

Golden's research experience includes Hosea, biblical usage of the divine name, Genesis 6-9, Jonah, the Book of the Twelve (Minor Prophets) and biblical intertextuality.

He is the author of *Blessed Be His Name: Revealing the Sacred Names of God* (Concordia Publishing House, 2021), *God's Own Son Is Born A Child* (Concordia Publishing House, 2019) and *LifeLight: Minor Prophets* (Concordia Publishing House, 2009). He contributed to the festschrift, *The Mercy of God in the Cross of Christ: Essays on Mercy in Honor of Glenn Merritt* (LCMS, 2016).


