
Thirteenth Sunday After Pentecost September 7, 2025



Pastor's Corner for September 7-13, 2025

One Awesome Story (Deuteronomy 30:15-20)

Sometimes I can't help thinking that God contradicts Himself. Especially reading the Old Testament next to the New Testament, it sure seems like God changed His mind somewhere in-between. It is almost as if we have two separate stories mistakenly glued together, leaving a mess of confusion on the table. Take these two verses for example, "If you obey the commandments of the Lord your God... He will bless you in the land that you are entering" (Deuteronomy 30:16). Sure sounds like I need to do something to live in God's presence! But then you hear God's Word in the New Testament, "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works" (Ephesians 2:8-9). God gives His presence for free with nothing I can do! Which is it? Is it only Old Testament = bad, New Testament = good? Not hardly.

Read a little farther in Ephesians, "For you may be sure of this, that everyone who is sexually immoral or impure, or who is covetous (that is, an idolater), has no inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and God" (v. 5). Here all of us are struck with the worry that we have no inheritance because we fall under at least one of these convictions!

So, which is it? The more I try and obey God's commands, the more I find myself breaking them. I fall into pride, contempt, anger, frustration, annoyance, and gossip the more I try to do what He wants me to. But if I simply do nothing, I have a guilty feeling that I'm falling from God by my laziness. "Wretched man that I am! Who will deliver me from this body of death?" (Romans 7:24).

Throughout God's Word, He always works for us before we work for Him. Look at the full story of our earlier passages, "You have seen all that the Lord did before your eyes in the land of Egypt" (Deut. 29:2), "Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us" (Eph. 5:2).

It's all about worship (Deut. 30:17). What is worship? Worship is to consistently turn away from ourselves to see and hear God. When we turn to God and away from ourselves, we find that all our needs in life are met by God's good and perfect gifts. There is nothing we need in life because all comes from our Lord and Savior who provides for both body and soul. Seeing that all our needs are met in God, obeying God (i.e. loving others) becomes a little more simple (though not always easy) because we are not trying to gain anything from anyone else since we have no more needs to be met. Realizing all we need has already been given to us from God frees us to live in His love for others.

There is no contradiction in God's Word, only One Story of a Savior who gives you all you need, freeing you to live for those He gives you.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace

Helping Children in Need Sleep Better

All children deserve a safe, comfortable place to lay their heads. Across the country, too many boys and girls go without a bed - or even a pillow - to sleep on. These children end up sleeping on couches, blankets, and even floors. This can affect their happiness and health.

That's where Sleep in Heavenly Peace comes in. We are volunteers who are dedicated to building, assembling, and delivering top-notch bunk beds to children and families in need.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP) provides the bed, mattress, and bedding to each child. Bedlessness is a real problem in the US with 2-3% of the population sleeping without beds.

A volunteer crew delivered to a family of three little girls that had all been sleeping on the same (broken) twin size bed. That same night, a bed was delivered to a 17-year-old that had never had a bed of his own.

SHP provides all the tools and expertise that allow people with little or no

experience to build all the components for a solid, wood bunk bed. It is always a fun-filled half day that ends with branding the beds. Fellowship is wonderful and the ability to solve a problem for others leaves everyone feeling a bit better about the world!


