Pastor's Corner for September 21-27, 2025

Take a Break (Amos 8:4-7)

Do you find yourself impatient with God? I'm not talking about His timing in worldly events or how He will guide you in a new stage of life or His ability to bring a certain person into His presence. While all these are important and valuable in our relationship with Him and those He gives us, there is another form of patience with God that we may overlook. Do you find yourself losing patience with God's call to spend time with Him?

Resting with God is hard because it does take time. Time that we often don't think we have to give. Sabbath rest is weekly worship in the community of His Church. Sabbath rest is daily devotions in the community of God and His Word. Sabbath rest is sitting in silence in the community of God and His Spirit. Sabbath

rest is prayer in the community of food and family. Sabbath rest, in its various forms and times, is the space we take throughout our days and weeks that is intentionally spent with God. And it is something that we can lose patience with.

God's people have always lost patience in resting with God. In Amos we hear God's people complaining, "When will the new moon and Sabbath be over that we may sell grain and wheat?" In other words, "when will this rest and quiet time be over so we can get on with our life? When will this time with God be separated from my activities so I can focus on myself again?". When we rush our Sabbath rest, or neglect it completely, we are neglecting our relationship with God. We are neglecting to take a rest that is necessary for our relationship with God.

God knows what His people need and He knows that we need rest. That is why He built it into the order and design of creation. On the seventh day of creation, God rested, not because He needed to, but because He knew that we need to. God gives us rest as a gift. When we don't make time to rest with God, there is a negative impact in our lives, relationships, emotions, households, and vocations. We become rushed, anxious, fearful, and stressed. Sabbath rest is not a quick fix to all our problems in daily life, but it reminds us that we are not going through this sinful world on our own. Sabbath rest reorients our focus towards the God who is leading us to The Day of perfect rest that is our guarantee by the Spirit. Our daily and weekly Sabbah rest is a practice for the day we pray for when we say, "Thy kingdom come."

Don't be impatient with the rest God wants to give you. Listen to His Word and His desire to draw you close and rest in His arms today and this week.

Helping Children in Need Sleep Better

All children deserve a safe, comfortable place to lay their heads. Across the country, too many boys and girls go without a bed - or even a pillow - to sleep on. These children end up sleeping on couches, blankets, and even floors. This can affect their happiness and health.

That's where Sleep in Heavenly Peace comes in. We are volunteers who are dedicated to building, assembling, and delivering top-notch bunk beds to children and families in need.

Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP) provides the bed, mattress, and bedding to each child. Bedlessness is a real problem in the US with 2-3% of the population sleeping without beds.

A volunteer crew delivered to a family of three little girls that had all been sleeping on the same (broken) twin size bed. That same night, a bed was delivered to a 17-year-old that had never had a bed of his own.

SHP provides all the tools and expertise that allow people with little or no experience to build all the components for a solid, wood bunk bed. It is always a fun-filled half day that ends with branding the beds. Fellowship is wonderful and the ability to solve a problem for others leaves everyone feeling a bit better about the world!
