Pastor's Corner for October 19-25, 2025

Fulfill Your Ministry (2 Timothy 3:14-4:5)

Stop what you're doing and read the above Bible verse. Thanks! It ends with a great sending word, "fulfill your ministry." What is your ministry? We can think ministry is only for those who work at a church. But that is far from the truth! As a baptized child of God, you are involved in ministry. It is God's ministry that He has welcomed you into the moment you became His child. That ministry happens to be wherever He has put you. Wherever you are, whatever you are doing, that is the ministry God has called you to right now. Whether you work in the office, at home, at the construction site, or in a lab. Whether you work for money, volunteer, or your income is the pleasure in watching your kids grow. No matter what you find yourself doing in daily life, be confident that it is ministry work!

Is your ministry full? We are called to fulfill our ministry, to do it, but is it a full ministry? We try and make our ministries full; full of our own goals, our own joys and happiness, our schedules, our people, full of ourselves. Our ministry won't be full if we see it as our own. Our ministry is really God's Ministry that we are a part of. Wherever you are, it is a place that is full of God's presence (whether you feel it or not). Bring the Word and prayer with you wherever He sends you. Subscribe to emails and apps that give reminders of God's full presence in your daily ministry. Where you are is where God can use you and it is full of Him!

Who are you teaching Jesus to in His Ministry? In verse 14, we hear Paul telling Timothy to remember the people who taught him the Word. Back in chapter one (1:5), we heard that Timothy's grandma Lois and mom Eunice taught him the faith. I'm willing to bet two things about Lois and Eunice's Ministry. One, they did it intentionally. Whatever it looked like, they were purposefully in the Word and daily prayed over young Timothy. Two, they had no idea what it would lead to. They had no idea that their grandson and son would grow to be a leader in the early church, and they definitely did not intend to be pillars of the faith that we are still talking about 2,000 years later! Be aware of the people God has intentionally paced in your Ministry and daily give 'em Jesus!

How long is it going to take? Paul reminds Timothy to do the work "with complete patience." Since this is God's Ministry, it is one that will take patience. God works the long game, and as irritating as that is at times it teaches us to rely on Him. Stick with it. Find joy in the fullness of His Word and the Ministry He has called you to. There's nothing better than being a part of God's Ministry!

study, and activities.




