Pastor's Corner for December 28-January 3

"Abba! Father!" (Galatians 4:4-7)

The post-Christmas season can be a little bit of a drag. Everything starts to empty out. Slowly, but surely, Christmas lights get taken down, family and friends go home or don't call as much, presents that were once new and exciting become old and mundane, and the Christmas tree and decorations are removed. Our homes, neighborhoods, and even our church go back to looking normal. All of this can make us a feel a little empty, as if God's work at Christmas really was just a celebration, something that only happens once a year and then that's it. As we trudge back into, what can seem empty to some but certainly routine for many, normal life, it can be easy to forget what the celebration was all about.
