¹⁸ While walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon (who is called Peter) and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea, for they were fishermen. ¹⁹ And he said to them,

"Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men."

²⁰ Immediately they left their nets and followed him.

²¹ And going on from there he saw two other brothers, James the son of Zebedee and John his brother, in the boat with Zebedee their father, mending their nets, and he called them.

²² Immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him.

²³ And he went throughout all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction among the people.

²⁴ So his fame spread throughout all Syria, and they brought him all the sick, those afflicted with various diseases and pains, those oppressed by demons, those having seizures, and paralytics, and he healed them.

God's Light in Unexpected Places (Isaiah 9:1-4) Third Sunday after the Epiphany: January 21 & 22, 2023

What is it about fear that makes us give up on anything good ever happening when life throws us curveballs? When we're in a dark place, there are times we may feel one step away from ever expecting the light to shine again. Today, we give thanks that God's light shines in life's most *unexpected* places!

1.	Light that shines in the darkness (verse 2) is God's promise to us on this of "Darkness" in God's Word does not only	
	refer to circumstances that may hinder our actions and ability to plan for the future. It describes situations of real danger as well as our perceptions of the world that lead to anxiety or despair. Isaiah shows us that at times truly seeing the darkness for what it truly is is just what we need!	
2.	"The people WALKING in darknesshave seen a great light." We might not be staring down an and tempted to make peace with them, as some of Isaiah's first listeners were; but our the is ever present. Busying ourselves to find earthly solutions to God-sized problems may work for a while. But sooner or later, everyone who keeps walking in the dark will stumble.	
3.	"Those DWELLING in a land of gloomfor them a light has dawned." We might not live in or among the and of Galilee (9:1), but we may indeed find ourselves in a "place" that makes us feel powerless and frozen today. Just when life circumstances close in on us and there seems to be no way out is exactly when we are called to look up and see the true light dawning!	
4.	Love is God's unexpected answer! God's forwhich we have done to earn or deserve—has "increased [our] joy" (9:3)! God's unexpected love is gifted to us like light shining in the last place you'd ever expect! That love for us is where our love for those who are "undeserving" shines light in a dark world. Jesus is the fulfillment of Isaiah's promise: the yoke of sin and death is broken. The Enemy is defeated. Wherever we might find ourselves todaywhatever darkness life might bring—the light of God's love shines. We treasure life together
