### **Blessing of the Manger Scene**

*In the 13th century St. Francis of Assisi started the Christmas custom of a creche, a scene showing the manger and stable where Jesus was born. Although the stable Jesus was born in may have been a cave, our creche reminds us how the very Son of God came into the world as a baby. The lowly manger also reminds us that Jesus is the Savior of all people, whether they are rich or poor. God sent His Son into the world, because God wants all people to be saved.*

*Our tree decorations are called Chrismons. The word is created from a combination of Christ and the Christ + monogram, thus Chrismon. If you look carefully at their design, the Chrismons have a story to tell. They tell about Christ's Name, His Life, and His Saving Work. The Chrismons also have designs that symbolically teach the doctrines of the church.*
