Matthew 27–28; Mark 15–16; Luke 23–24; John 19–20

Family Discussion Starters:

- ·What is one thing you remember from this week's Bible story?
- · What did Peter and John see inside Jesus' tomb?
- · How would you have felt if you saw Jesus' empty tomb?
- · Who can you tell about the good news that Jesus is alive?

Family Activities:

- •Throw a "Jesus Is Alive" family dance party. Play upbeat worship music. Laugh, dance, and sing songs to celebrate Jesus' resurrection.
- Enlist family members to help fold laundry. Take time to show your child how to fold cloths and towels. Remind your preschoolers how Peter and John ran to the tomb and found the cloth that was wrapped around Jesus lying there. But Jesus was not there because Jesus is alive!



Jesus Is Our Perfect King

Colossians 1

Family Discussion Starters:

- · What is one thing you remember from this week's Bible story?
- · Who wrote a letter to the church in Colossae?
- · How does Jesus show us what God is like?
- Why is Jesus most important?

Family Activities:

- Set a schedule for each family member to be king or queen for a day. Allow him
 privileges to pick meals and to be served first. At the end of each day, talk about
 the good and not-so-good ways the family member reigned over the family.
 Compare those ways of ruling to the perfect ways Jesus rules as King.
- •Organize a family worship night for your family. Make it a night of reading Scripture, singing songs, and praising Jesus as the perfect King. Invite preschoolers to lead in singing songs that exalt Jesus as King over your family and over all creation.
