DAVID SINNED AND WAS FORGIVEN 2 Samuel 11-12

King David sent out Israel's army. David stayed in Jerusalem. One evening, David looked out from his palace and saw a beautiful woman named Bathsheba. Bathsheba was the wife of Uriah, one of the best warriors in David's army. David sent his messengers to get Bathsheba, and she came to David's house. Later, Bathsheba told David that she was going to have a baby; the baby was David's.

David knew he had sinned, so David made a plan. First, David called Uriah home from the battle. But Uriah didn't think it was fair for him to relax at home while the other men were at war. Uriah slept on David's doorstep and refused to visit his wife.

David made a new plan. He instructed the leader of the army to send Uriah into the hardest part of the battle so he would be killed. This time, David's plan worked. David took Bathsheba into his house to be his wife, and she had a baby boy. God sent Nathan the prophet to talk to David. Nathan told David a story: A traveler came to a rich man who had many animals. The rich man did not offer his own animal. Instead, he took a poor man's lamb—the only lamb he had—and gave it to the traveler to eat.

This story made David feel angry. "You are the man!" Nathan said. God had given David a position of great power, and David took what wasn't his. David realized he had sinned against God.


THE STORY OF THE GOSPEL
