ISAIAH WARNED OF GOD'S JUDGMENT

Isaiah 22; 48

Isaiah was a prophet to the kingdom of Judah. He had seen a vision of what would happen to the city of Jerusalem. He warned that God's judgment was coming to the people.

God's people had chosen to turn away from Him and worship idols and false gods like their neighbors did. Isaiah said that God's judgment was coming for the nations around Judah.

Then he said that judgment was coming to Judah too. Judah's enemy—the Babylonians—would come into Jerusalem and take over the city.


Isaiah told the people to repent. In his vision, Isaiah saw that instead of turning back to God, they ignored his warning.

The people of Judah would be punished for their sin, but Isaiah also brought them a message of hope. God's people would be captured by the Babylonians, but one day

they would be set free.

God would punish their sin because He wanted what was best for them. God would act for His glory and their good. "When you escape from Babylon," Isaiah said, "Go tell the good news of what God has done for you."

Christ Connection: God sent Isaiah to warn of His coming judgment. A greater day of judgment is coming when God will judge sin for a final time. Jesus came to die on the cross and rise again. Everyone who repents of sin and trusts in Jesus will be safe from God's judgment and have eternal life.

The Bible tells us what is true about God and about ourselves. All of the stories in the Bible fit together to tell us the big story of how God rescues sinners through His Son, Jesus.


