King David wrote a psalm, or song, to the Lord. He praised God, who knows every person completely and is always with us.


David wrote, “Lord, You know me. You know when I sit down and when I stand up. You know everything I think about. You know when I travel and when I rest; You know everything about me.

“Everywhere I go, You are there with me. I cannot run from You or hide from You.

“You created me. You formed me in my mother’s womb. I will praise You because I have been remarkable and wondrously made. Everything You make and do is wonderful! You planned out all my days.”

David ended his psalm with this prayer: “Search me, God, and know my heart. Test me and know what makes me worry. See if I am doing wrong and lead me on the right path forever.”

The Bible tells us what is true about God and about ourselves. All of the stories in the Bible fit together to tell us the big story of how God rescues sinners through His Son, Jesus.


» Look up Psalm 139 in your Bible. Write out six things God knows about you.
