



BIBLE STORY SUMMARY:

- God's people continued to dishonor God by complaining about His provision and accusing Him of leading them to die in the wilderness.
- God sent venomous snakes into their camp to judge them; everyone who was bit died.
- · The people repented and asked for mercy.
- · God instructed Moses to make a bronze snake and hang it on a stick.
- Everyone who was bit could look at the snake and live.

CHRIST CONNECTION:

God sent snakes to punish the people, but anyone who was bitten could look at the snake on the pole and live. We deserve to die because of our sin, but anyone who looks to Jesus on the cross and trusts in Him will live forever with God.
