TAKING ATTENDANCE

 You will have an attendance folder in your classroom. Mark "P" for "Present or "A" for "Absent". We do not record tardiness. Please take attendance at the beginning of class. When completed, leave the folder outside your door in the hallway. Hall monitors will come around to pick them up.

Arrival and Dismissal Procedure

Catechists and volunteers: please remain in your classrooms after we announce over the intercoms that the children will be heading down. Children will begin heading to your classroom around 10 minutes before class begins, please arrive at least 20 minutes early.

Dismissal will be in the **Gym on Sundays**: Catechists will lead students up to the gym when your class is called and the parents will enter the gym to retrieve their children.

Dismissal will be in the **Church on Tuesdays and Wednesdays**. Catechists will lead students through Door #8 and into the Church to your class' assigned sections. Choir practice will be going on so please ask the children to remain quiet and pray as they wait.

UNIT 2 - TRINITY

Our Topic This Month is The Trinity

The Most Holy Trinity is one of the great mysteries of our Faith. There is one God who is three Divine Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is a mystery because our human minds simply can't comprehend it. A story I like to use to illustrate this comes from the life of St. Augustine.


When St. Augustine was trying to uncover the mystery of how three persons can be in God, he noticed a little boy cupping water from the ocean and pouring it into a little hole he had dug on the beach. When St. Augustine asked the child what he was doing, the little boy said he was trying to pour the entire ocean into the hole. St. Augustine chuckled and told him that it was impossible to fit all of the water into the hole. The little boy replied that it is indeed impossible, just as it is impossible for the mystery of the Trinity to fit into Augustine's head! And with that, the little boy vanished!

Although we will never fully understand this mystery, through Faith, we can grasp what it is as much as our human minds will allow. This has

been demonstrated through the teachings of Sacred Tradition and by Saints like St. Patrick, who used a three-leaved shamrock. Check the Dropbox for some more ways we can help the children to come to know the Trinity.

IDEAS FOR THIS MONTH

- Introduce the Rosary October is the month of the Rosary. The rosary is a way to tell the Blessed Virgin Mary "I love you" and ask her for help when we need it. Jesus gave Mary to be our mom in heaven so it's always nice to remember our mom. Maybe pray a decade with the children or watch a video on the rosary. See below for some fun rosary crafts!
- The Trinity in Prayer We profess our belief in the Trinity through our prayers. For 1st and 2nd graders, remind them of where we hear the Three Persons in the Sign of the Cross and the Glory Be prayers. For 3rd through 6th graders, let students see where the Trinity is in not only the Glory Be but also the Apostles' and Nicene Creeds.
- Do a Trinity or Rosary craft: There are some fun crafts in our drop box as well as this link <u>HERE</u> for the Trinity and <u>HERE</u> for the Rosary.
- Pray to Jesus in the Mass The Mass isn't just the greatest and most powerful prayer God has given us, it is a re-presentation (not representation) of Jesus' sacrifice on the cross. Meaning, that at every Mass we are united with every Christian in the whole world who is at Mass, not just now, but in the past and future, too. Not only that but all the saints and angels are present with us as well! So, we are with Jesus as he is nailed to the cross, died, and resurrected. We are at Calvery! This doesn't mean that His Sacrifice happens over and over again, but it is re-presented to us at every Mass. Now, if this sounds like some time-travel shenanigans, don't worry it is!
- Complete the Chapter Review Work on the Chapter 4 review as a class. This helps them remember your discussions and shows parents what was learned at session!

For over 38 years, Dr. Ginter has taught in parishes, high schools, universities, and seminaries. 
