

FROM OUR STUDENT AND CONNECTIONS MINISTER...

Growing up in the home in which I was raised, there were a few things that were absolutely certain. First, unless you were on your death bed, you were going to go to church. It was never an option. I might miss school. I might miss ball practice. I was not missing church. Second, I was going to do something. Coming home from school and just sitting around was never an option. While it was normally a sport, there was always an extra-curricular activity we were involved in. Starting at the age of 3 until I was out of school, I was on some type of organized sports team. Depending on the time of year, I was normally on multiple teams. Between my two siblings and me, we played football, baseball, basketball, softball, cheerleading, soccer, golf, and track & field. On top of that, there were voice lessons, piano lessons, quiz bowl teams, and many other clubs/activities we were a part of. This was just the way it was in our home growing up. Finally, the last certainty of life growing up in the Jackson home was that you were going to have a respect for certain genres of music. You might not like them, but you appreciated them. Those three genres were Gospel (Gaithers, Gold City, etc.), country (Willie Nelson, John Denver), and classic rock. Depending on the day, there would be one of these three genres playing on the record player and I have had an appreciation for them since I was young.

One of his favorite bands to listen to is still Queen. I knew all the lyrics to Bohemian Rhapsody before I could spell it. After Little League baseball games, if we won, we would go home and listen to "Another One Bites the Dust". I appreciated that song as a child because of the simplicity of it. The lyrics were easy to learn, and the melody was very catchy. I wouldn't classify it as one of my favorites but it definitely holds a nostalgic place in my heart.

However, it wasn't until recently that I learned that the phrase, "Another One Bites the Dust" didn't originate with Freddie Mercury and the band Queen. In fact, that phrase had been around for over a century before Queen released that record in 1980. While I cannot say it with absolute certainty, what I was told was that during the Civil War, a soldier would be shot and killed on the battlefield and would fall facedown onto the ground. When this happened, it was said about the soldier that another one has bitten the dust. I can't help but think about how devastating the death of a soldier is and now the phrase has been adapted into a fun, catchy song, 2,000 years ago, a death took place in Jerusalem. That death was devastating, horrific, and an absolute catastrophe. However today, when we think about the death of Christ, we cannot help but celebrate the resurrection. What was thought to be the end of Jesus was him conquering death. When it comes to our spiritual life, when we live in Christ we will never "bite the dust" but will live for all eternity in and through Him. This is why we go and serve.
