



FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR...

James 1:22 – But be doers of the word and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves.

One of our common idioms is the saying, "Face the music." There are two different origin stories behind this idiom. One is that it comes from 19th-century America. This story begins on the actor's stage. The actor, whether well-prepared or not, had to "face the music" when the time came to perform because the orchestra was (and still is) in front of the performer. Another origin story comes from military tradition. In this tradition, the saying is said to have started because dismissing an officer meant they had to face the band as they were marched out; hence, they had to "face the music." The origin of this saying may be debated, but the meaning is quite clear. To "face the music" is to accept the consequences of one's decision, no matter how harsh they are.

This week, we begin our fall sermon series on the book of James. James writes a very practical book on growing in practical faith. Faith is not just a theory for James. It is meant to be lived out, day after day. James 1:22 is the theme verse of his letter. He wants his readers not only to hear what God says but also to take the important step of doing it. There are over 50 commands in this short letter. This might seem like a simple idea, but far too many people sit in church, hear God's word weekly, and fail to put it into action. Too many will stand before God one day and have to "face the music." I don't want to have to do that, and I don't want you to have to either. I pray you will make a special effort to come each Sunday, listen to God's word preached, and then commit to putting it into practice.


