

Then the manager said to himself, 'What will I do, now that my master is taking the position away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. I have decided what to do so that, when I am dismissed as manager, people may welcome me into their homes.' So, summoning his master's debtors one by one, he asked the first, 'How much do you owe my master?' He answered, 'A hundred jugs of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, sit down quickly, and make it fifty.' Then he asked another, 'And how much do you owe?' He replied, 'A hundred containers of wheat.' He said to him, 'Take your bill and make it eighty.' And his master commended the dishonest manager because he had acted shrewdly; for the children of this age are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone, they may welcome you into the eternal homes. "Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much; and whoever is dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. If then you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is your own? No slave can serve two masters; for a slave will either hate the one and love the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth."

Holy and gracious God: in your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

WHAT MAKES ST. ANDREW'S FEEL LIKE HOME TO YOU?

On Sunday, September 14, we began this year's stewardship conversation by sharing what our beloved church means to us. The conversation was heartfelt and spiritually rich. Here's what you said.

1. What Makes St. Andrew's Feel Like Home to You?

"The warm and loving embrace of accepting me as I am . . . The openness and warmth of the people . . . Generosity and caring of members . . . Familiar faces, connections to prior family generations, architecture and focus . . . Familiarity of repetitive liturgies . . . Community (belonging) . . . My puzzle piece fits here . . . The hugs . . . The love of God and her wonder can be seen here . . . Unmasked . . . Church smell (especially after opening doors after COVID) . . . The people feel like family except they let me be myself . . . Compassion . . . Friends . . . The people . . . Beauty of the gardens, the people have pride of place, nurturing community . . . Comfortable, I can be my true self . . . Same as coming "home" as we normally think of Home."

Our young future leaders said: "Because it is a safe place, there are people I know, and it makes me feel happy . . . People are nice to me . . . Because St. Andrew's accepts me for who I am, opening their doors and arms open, not judging me."

2. What Kind of People is God Calling Us to Be?

"Carriers of the Light of Christ . . . The kind of people who love their enemies the most. . . Servants and believers . . . She is calling us to be her hands and feet and show her loving kindness . . . The best of who we are . . . Better than I used to be . . . Loving, compassionate, forgiving, accepting . . . I believe he is calling us to be Christ-like: loving, brave, humble, faithful . . . Seeing a need and filling that space . . . To be love incarnate in the world . . . Unconditionally accepting . . . Genuine."

Our young future leaders said: "God wants me to speak up and fight for who we are and guide others out of the darkness . . . God reminds me to pray for the people who have died, are sick, and so many other things."
