

What then are we to say was gained by Abraham, our ancestor according to the flesh? For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God. For what does the scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was reckoned to him as righteousness." Now to one who works, wages are not reckoned as a gift but as something due. But to one who without works trusts him who justifies the ungodly, such faith is reckoned as righteousness. For the promise that he would inherit the world did not come to Abraham or to his descendants through the law but through the righteousness of faith. If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. For the law brings wrath; but where there is no law, neither is there violation. For this reason it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his descendants, not only to the adherents of the law but also to those who share the faith of Abraham (for he is the father of all of us, as it is written, "I have made you the father of many nations") —in the presence of the God in whom he believed, who gives life to the dead and calls into existence the things that do not exist.

"Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. "Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."





Holy and gracious God: in your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me.

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

#### All Christ has died. Christ has risen. Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O God, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept. Please remain standing or kneeling as you are able.

Celebrant Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;

*People* Therefore let us keep the feast.

#### Invitation to the Table

Welcome to the Lord's Table. The ushers assist people in approaching the altar rail for Holy Communion. Please wait until just before taking communion to remove your mask and replace it immediately afterwards. We will be offering communion in both kinds. We will offer two chalices: one for those who wish to sip from the cup, and one for those who wish to dip their communion wafer in the wine. Those who do not receive the Eucharist but would like a blessing may come forward and simply cross their hands over their chests. You may offer silent prayers in your pew both before and after communion. Some suggestions are found in the BCP, pp. 834 and 337. In order to share the Body of Christ with those who have dietary limitations, we also consecrate rice-flour wafers. When you approach the altar rail, simply tell the Celebrant that you are wheat or glutenfree.



- Online Compline: Join us for Compline on Tuesday and Thursday evenings at 8:00 p.m. We stream the services live on our <u>Facebook page</u>.
- Discernment Committee Update: We continue to meet weekly and are now receiving names of potential rectors. This means that we are not able to answer any questions about applicants, including: how many applicants there are, who they are, where they live, or any other identifying details. Thank you for respecting their confidentiality and ours. We are grateful for your continued prayer support, encouragement, and for the good God who loves us all.

• New Outreach Ministry Opportunity: One of the singers who joined our choir for the Epiphany Lessons and Carols service is a member of and the outreach ministry co-chair at Manakin Episcopal Church. She has invited St. Andrew's to join a group of churches who rotate providing lunch to four Richmond-area shelters for the unhoused. If St. Andrew's joined in this ministry, we would provide, pack, and deliver 110 bagged lunches to four shelters (two on Hull Street, two downtown) on one or more Saturdays in 2023. Each bagged lunch must contain a sandwich, salty snack, sweet treat, and a piece of fruit, but we can choose exactly what goes in the lunches. The total food cost is approximately \$200-\$225 (not including the brown bags, baggies, and napkins).

At Manakin Church, volunteers meet at church on the delivery day where the sandwiches are made and lunches are packed within 30 minutes, then one or two volunteers deliver the lunches to the four shelters. We could use this model, or we could pack lunches in our homes, drop them off at St. Andrew's on delivery day, and a couple of volunteers could distribute the lunches to the four shelters.

One of the things that emerged early in the discernment process is that St. Andrew's feels most "itself" when doing service and outreach. It is also attractive to prospective priests-in-charge and younger folks looking for a church. Most important, though, is that this kind of ministry is a way to practice Jesus' Way of Love.
