BECOMING

Who are you becoming?

No matter our age, we are all in a state of becoming. We are becoming someone every day, through what we read, what we hear, what we view, who we spend time with, and what we do. So, who are you becoming? What are you listening to, what are you reading, what do you watch, who do you spend time with . . . and are they drawing you closer to Christ? Are they helping you love like Christ?

We become who we love and who we love shapes what we become. ~St. Clare of Assisi

As Christians, our becoming has a purpose and a person to imitate: we are meant to become more like Jesus. We do that by following Jesus' way of life. The way of holiness, in community, pouring out compassion, and giving witness to the pathway of love.

But this doesn't happen on autopilot. How are you working to make that happen?

As a parish, who we are becoming is reflected in what each of our members is becoming. How you steward your resources has a large influence on who you are becoming. If nothing else, it reveals what you are truly trying to become.

TIME. How we spend our time shows us not only what we are now, but what we will become. It shows us our values, our character, our priorities. Ask yourself these questions: Do I spend time daily growing closer to Jesus in prayer? Do I truly value my Catholic faith, my parish, and the sharing of the Good News of Jesus? Does how I give my time reflect that? Who am I becoming or who do I want to become based on how I give my time?

TALENT. We all have gifts given to us by God for the good of others. These gifts are essential in the "becoming" of our parish and of other people. Ask yourself: What gifts and talents do I have that can help build up our parish community? What gifts or talents do I have that God wants me to use to bless other people and draw them closer to Him? Looking at how I use my talents, who am I becoming and who do I want to become?

TREASURE. In a world obsessed with wealth, we know that "Where your treasure is, there your heart shall be." A great test to see who we are becoming is looking at what we are spending our money on. Ask yourself this question: Does what I spend my money on reflect who I want to become? Does my financial commitment to the parish reflect what I want the parish to become?

Who are you becoming? Who do you want to become? How can you grow in greater imitation of Christ in order to be Christ's love for others?

Service Handbook 2025

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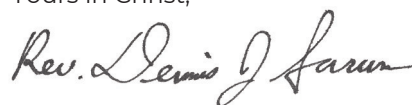
Beloved,

HOW TO USE THIS HANDBOOK

A missionary disciple is someone who hears the call, consciously decides to make Christ the center of their life, and works to reorder their life around His will through prayer, the sacraments, discernment, and action. It is our hope that you take time to reflect on your commitment to foster growth as a disciple.

1. Center yourself in prayer. Ask God to reveal to you what He needs you to do to build His Kingdom.
2. God has bestowed you with particular charisms (gifts) to accomplish His work. It is unique to you

for His glory. Review this handbook to identify how you can use your gifts at for the benefit of your St. Dominic parish family. Opportunities to serve are listed by ministry areas and teams.

3. See something that interests you? Contact the staff person indicated who will assist in answering your questions and getting you started. Staff contact information is on page 8 (back cover).

LITURGICAL MINISTRY

Altar Server-Adult: Adults assist the priest at weekday, Holy Day, and Sunday 7:30 AM Masses. Training is provided.

Altar Server-Youth: Boys and girls in grades 4 and up are invited to serve at the weekend Masses. Training is provided.

Art and Environment: Plan and prepare the liturgical environment to aid and reflect our prayer; once per month and holidays.

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion: Assist the clergy at Mass by distributing the Precious Body and Blood of Christ to the congregation. Training is provided.

Hospitality Minister: Adults and teens greet and seat people at Masses, help with the Communion procession, collections, and bulletin distribution.

Lector: Adults proclaim the Word of God at Sunday and Holy Day Masses. Weekday lectors are scheduled for 8:30 AM Masses on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. Training is provided.

MUSIC MINISTRY

Adult Choir: Enthusiastic and gifted singers are invited to participate. Rehearsals are on Thursday evenings.

Choir typically serves at the 9:00 AM Sunday Mass.

Cantors: Singers who present advanced musical ability and leadership skills are called upon to be cantors. Cantors lead sung prayer at all Masses. Rehearsals are on Wednesdays at 10:30 AM and Thursdays at 5:00 PM. An audition is required.

Instrumentalists: Instrumentalists are encouraged to bring their talent to the parish community. An audition is required.

Sunday Evening Mass Ensemble: Our Contemporary ensemble welcomes teens and young adults to share their musical talents or vocal abilities at our Sunday Evening Masses.

PRAYER MINISTRY

Eucharistic Adorer: Private adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is offered every Tuesday from 1:00 - 7:30 PM. Sign up to be a regular (weekly) adorer or a substitute.

Intentional Prayer Team: Pray with others after weekend Masses. Training is provided.

Safeguarding All God's Family training is mandatory for all 18 years and older who serve with children and students.

CHILD MINISTRY

Child Minister: Stacey Irvine

Catechists: Plan and teach age appropriate lessons for small groups of children in K3 through Grade 5. Materials, training, and support are provided. All classrooms have two (2) adults present in the room.

Catechist Substitute: Fill in for a catechist due to an occasional absence. In most cases, these absences are known in advance. It is the responsibility of the catechist to provide the substitute with adequate lesson plans.

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLOW) Leaders: Prepare sessions as well as facilitate small group discussions for children during the Sunday 9:00 AM Masses. Adults and high school students are encouraged to join our team.

Vacation Bible School (VBS): Help create the themed environment prior to VBS or be a station leader, small group assistant, or photographer during this program the last full week of July.

STUDENT MINISTRY

Middle School Minister: Karissa Tousignant

High School Minister: Sami Taylor

Core Team: Journey with middle school or high school students to lead them closer to Christ through Edge or Life Teen. Build relationships with teens and assist in planning, participating, and facilitating through small group discussions, short talks, and activities. Training and support are provided through core team gatherings and ongoing adult formation. We'd love to take you to coffee to tell you more and help you in discerning joining our team!

Confirmation Core Team: Lead a small group of candidates during their confirmation journey. This includes the retreat experience and weekly small groups for a semester. Training, materials and on-going support are provided.

Senior Leadership: For high school students looking to put their discipleship into practice as a peer leader. Lead in EDGE, Emmaus, retreat teams, and other student ministry offerings.

ADULT MINISTRY

Small Group Facilitator: After a period of formation and training in our Missionary Disciple Training Group, small group facilitators lead groups of 6-10 people in Holy Spirit-driven conversations around Scripture with the goal of helping each member grow closer to Christ. **Contact Claire Ziolkowski**

Welcome Team: As we encourage disciples to extend a hand to the stranger, we invite parishioners to join the Welcome Team. This is a group of warm and welcoming individuals that extend a greeting to our new members and invite them into the life of the parish. We strive to have no strangers among us!

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) Team (Journey to Become Catholic): Parish members act as catechists and sponsors, walking with candidates and catechumens through the various stages of the OCIA journey. **Contact Mary Lestina**

Adult Confirmation: Help facilitate formation sessions for baptized Catholics who have received 1st Communion but have not been confirmed. **Contact Mary Lestina**

Vocations Team: Help create a culture for vocations and provide awareness and enrichment opportunities related to ordained ministry, lay ministry, religious life, married, and single life. **Contact Mary Lestina**

Young Adult Team: Help launch ministry opportunities to form disciples amongst those aged 19-35, single and married. **Contact Fr. David Sweeney**

Pastoral Care

Bereavement Ministry: Serve parish families who have suffered a loss. Trained adult ministers provide comfort and support to grieving families. There are sessions offered during the year for bereavement in addition to providing support for individuals.

Called to Serve: Volunteers provide help to members in need of assistance such as raking, weeding, painting, and other tasks around the home.

Funeral Minister: Assist with funeral liturgies as acolytes and helpers to acclimate people with their role as readers, gift bearers, etc. Training is provided.

Funeral Receptions: Serve food and refreshments for families during their social gathering.

Helping Hands Ministry: Provide meals to parish families or individuals who are in need due to illness, a new baby, family death, etc. Members are typically asked to provide meals 2-3 times per year.

Hospital & Medical Care Facility Visits: Visit hospitalized and nursing home bound parishioners as appropriate. Trained ministers provide Communion

when possible. Schedule visits according to your own availability. Any level of commitment is welcome. Training is provided. *(Due to HIPAA laws, we need to be informed when parishioners are in need of these visits).*

Marriage Prep: Trained sponsor couples provide support for engaged couples and meet with engaged couples to help them understand married life and the challenges that they will face. In addition, sponsor couples help on the wedding day and support the priest or deacon where needed. Additional volunteers can serve as Acolytes.

Pastoral Visits Ministry: Targeted specifically at parishioners who are homebound due to illness or age and unable to attend services at church. Members can visit socially, pray with them, and bring Communion. Training is provided. Confidentiality is required.

Prayer Shawl Ministry: Make prayer shawls with others who love to knit for individuals who are ill, facing surgery, or in need of comfort. Members pray for the recipients and the shawls are blessed at Mass before distribution.

Outreach

Giving Tree: Help with preparations and organizing gifts for this annual effort in which parishioners provide Christmas gifts for those in need served through outreach organizations and for elderly religious sisters.

Lenten Outreach: During Lent, parish members of all ages engage in service by cleaning, organizing, painting, and repairing for local parishes or organizations in need.

St. Dismas Jail Ministry: Bring Christ to the inmates of Waukesha County Jail by providing Communion services, bible study, and individual visits with inmates. Open to adults. Opportunities are varied, but rewarding. Training is required for in-jail services.

St. Vincent de Paul Ministry: Help the poor in Brookfield and Waukesha County through home visits, financial help, food, clothing, etc. Confidentiality is essential and training is required. Meets twice a month to review impact and develop strategies. New members are always welcome.

Affiliated Ministry—Knights of Columbus: Through the Building the Domestic Church initiative, Knights and their families have greater opportunities to participate in a variety of activities and service that deepen their faith, promote the New Evangelization, and strengthen our parishes.

Human Resources Committee: A well-functioning human resources committee is a valuable asset to the parish, pastor, pastoral council, and staff, by helping to educate and advise in the broad area of human resource management.

Handymen/Women: Offer your skills in project management, light electrical, carpentry, plumbing, etc. You will be added to a list based on skills for sporadic projects as needed.

Holy Dusters: Maintain our worship space by vacuuming and cleaning windows, woodwork, sacristies, etc. on Mondays at 9:30 AM on a rotating basis. A member is needed for scheduling the holy dusters.

Parish Center Receptionist: Receptionists are needed for four-hour shifts: 9:00 AM - 1:00 PM Tuesdays and Thursdays, 1:00 PM - 5:00 PM Monday through Thursday, and Friday 12:00 PM - 3:00 PM to answer and transfer calls, greet and assist visitors, and complete office tasks. Working knowledge of MS Office is helpful.

Livestream Tech Team: Assist in livestreaming Masses and other events on campus. Skills or willingness to be trained in camera operations, video editing, and production. Adults and teens welcome.

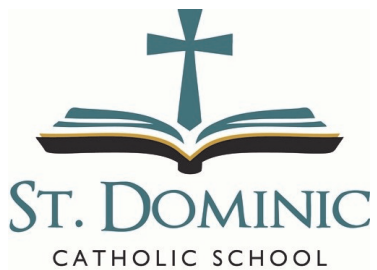

Safeguarding All God's Family training is mandatory for all 18 years and older who serve with children and students.



Alumni Association/Development: Help find classmates, develop communication strategies, and plan events to build alumni relations.

Athletic Board: Help organize and run the parish athletic programs.

Athletic Coaches, Managers and Coordinators: Coaches, managers, and coordinators are needed for boys and girls volleyball (fall), basketball (winter), tennis and track (spring) for grades 5 through 8. You don't need to be a school parent to participate, just someone who is enthusiastic about developing a love of the game and good sportsmanship with students.

Catholic Identity Team: This group works as a sub-committee of School Advisory to ensure the Gospel of Jesus is given living expression in our school in a way that offers all students lifelong meaning and purpose.

Chess Team Coach: Organize and supervise students as they learn the finer points of this game of strategy.

Classroom Helpers: Assist teaching staff with a wide assortments of classroom tasks or working with small groups of students in math and reading.

Family Fun Night: Help organize this family night of games, music, snacks, and camaraderie. The event is usually held in February or March.

Fine Arts Association: Assist with programming for grades K4-8 in the fine arts; music, visual arts, drama, and dance and provide help for performances.

Forensics: Help organize, coach, and judge as part of the Forensics program. Forensics is an individual and team competition for students in grades 4-8 in various

categories of speech.

High Interest Day: Assist in planning for this all-school spring event. Involvement begins in September with monthly meetings. Help by contacting presenters, scheduling classes, or by organizing the luncheon.

Library Team: Assist with fall and spring book fair preparations, sales, and clean up. Update the library database, cover and shelf books.

Office Helpers: Help in big and small ways with a wide variety of opportunities based on your availability; everything from filing and phone calling.

Playground/Cafeteria Help: Assist our staff in supervising students and offering a helping hand from 11:40 AM to 12:40 PM every school day. This is a great way to meet the kids and foster the community atmosphere at St. Dominic Catholic School.

School Marketing: Bring your St. Dominic pride and offer your assistance as a school ambassador, new family mentor, media liaison, or as a writer, editor, photographer, or graphic designer. We have opportunities for one-time projects or year round involvement.

Scout Leaders: Individuals lead troops for boys and girls.

Scrip: Members process orders, enter data in the system, and fill orders.

Spirit Sale: Assist with the sale of spirit wear and other items. Meet with the vendor, organize, process, and distribute orders to families. Most effort is required mid-August through early November.

Teacher Appreciation: Assist with luncheons about four times per year and also provide extra "treats" for staff on a rotating basis throughout the year.
