Beloved.

This has been a year of change for us. We said goodbye to Fr. Tim Schumaker as he assumed his new role as parish administrator for St. Joseph Parish in Grafton, and welcomed newly ordained Fr. David Sweeney, one of nine newly ordained priests for the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. While those were dramatic changes, we avoided another one when the archbishop granted me a second six-year term as pastor.

We have also had great success in response to our Missionary Discipleship efforts. We call it "The Way." Many of our parishioners have taken missionary discipleship training which has resulted in numerous small groups that meet regularly to deepen their relationship with Jesus and each other. There is still more to do. Our word for this year and the year ahead is "accompaniment." My wish is that every member will be so comfortable in their faith that they witness that faith to the world. Witnessing doesn't mean selling, it primarily means living a faith-filled life to such regard that others wonder and question the source of your joy. St. John Paul II said it this way, "The Church imposes nothing; she only proposes, she proposes like a lover to the beloved." Our mission at St. Dominic is to grow so deeply in your love of God, that you will share your faith with excitement.

Your generosity has served us in being able to support Catholic school education without a tuition increase again for the majority of our families. We have also been able to provide formation for all ages, fostering our relationship with Jesus. Our facilities needed some major work. We replaced the aging heating and air-conditioning system for our church, as well as completed a variety of other maintenance projects. While we received grant money for security upgrades, as they have for everyone, all our costs have increased, often by double digits.

What every new member notices is that St. Dominic is a warm, comfortable place that feels like home from their very first visit. It is because St. Dominic radiates the love and caring we have for each other. People enter and they feel that God is present. That is the hallmark of St. Dominic and I am proud as your pastor to serve you.

Our Discipleship Commission continues to develop opportunities to support parishioners who want to grow closer to God and are being called out in mission to joyfully lead others to Christ.

We invite you to discover your unique mission and take the next step on your journey of a lifetime.

#### MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP TRAINING

Missionary Discipleship Training is for those who want to learn how to give witness to Christ in their daily life and desire to accompany others in their faith journey. We added 40 trained missionary disciples who went through the 12-week training in order to learn how to take their personal relationship with Jesus out into the world. We now have nearly 100 members trained for missionary discipleship. As a result of all of these participants being formed and sent on mission, we had leaders joining our Core Teams for EDGE, Emmaus, and Life Teen, and others taking roles on our parish commissions. Three new small groups were formed, and other participants discerned personal apostolates such as mission trips to Africa and knitting hats for those served through our Giving Tree.

#### **CALLED & GIFTED WORKSHOPS**

Offered twice per year, Called & Gifted Workshops assisted adults in learning to discern, develop, and use their spiritual gifts (charisms) in order to experience the joy of living out their unique purpose in God's plan, and His will for their life, through the prompting and power of the Holy Spirit.

#### **SMALL GROUPS**

The demand for small groups grew beyond capacity. Small groups accompany one another in their faith journey, coming together for prayer, scripture study, and service, while building relationships that challenge and support one another as they walk with Christ.

The need for more small group leaders necessitated plans to form more people with the confidence and skills to lead a small group while providing ongoing support.

Two existing small groups completed the Missionary Discipleship Training together as a way to take the next step in growing as missionary disciples.

#### **DISCIPLESHIP COMMISSION**

The Discipleship Commission planned and offered The Way Workshops to help parishioners quickly learn how to pray with others, share God moments easily and effectively, and to understand charisms better.

Evangelical Catholic was invited to present "Go Make Disciples: How to Accompany Others into a Jesus-Led Life," which included practical tools based on the resource, *The 10:10 Challenge*.

#### **EUCHARISTIC MIRACLES OF THE WORLD**

Over 400 guests from around the archdiocese, plus parishioners and our school population, immersed themselves in the displays of the Eucharistic Miracles recognized by the Church, that have taken place throughout the ages in various countries of the world. Sixty three volunteers welcomed and provided hospitality.

#### **40 HOURS OF ADORATION**

We offered 40 hours of Eucharistic Adoration as part of the Eucharistic Miracles event. To ensure our Lord was never alone, 83 people signed up as adorers. There were 64 guests from around the archdiocese who signed in, but many did not. A relic of Blessed Carlo Acutis was also displayed during limited times.

- We said farewell to Fr. Tim Schumaker and welcomed newly ordained Fr. David Sweeney as our next associate pastor.
- During Advent, we dug deeply into the lessons Mary has to share about welcoming Jesus into our lives, and in Lent, we transitioned from the wood of the manger to the wood of the cross. Various opportunities were offered during these liturgical seasons, including Advent and Lent Gospel groups and Nights of Reflection.
- In April, Fr. Tim led a group of 39 pilgrims on the Camino de Santiago.
- We continue to offer Eucharistic Adoration on Tuesdays and throughout the year, including adoration time for our school students.

My story has no drama. I was not knocked off my horse. It is more a story about a general pull in the direction of Jesus. Sometimes it was conscious. Sometimes unconscious. Sometimes the pull was intermittent. Sometimes it was direct and strong. I went to parochial school. I went to Catholic high school. That filled me with an understanding of traditions, but not necessarily faith. Marriage and children made me understand that I was part of something beyond myself. Martha and I joined St. Dominic and immersed ourselves in the community. I liked going to Mass. I liked doing acts of service. I was (generally) a rule follower. I was part of a community, but my faith was self-centered. The things I did made me feel good about being good, but Jesus was not always at the center. The part that was missing was the part about "going forth." Participating in a Missionary Discipleship group at St. Dominic helped me understand that discipleship is putting Jesus firmly at the center of life, and then going forth to make more disciples. With the support of this community, my journey continues.

#### **ADULT MINISTRY**

- An Active Adult Group was launched to connect adults through faith and fun.
- Tuesday Time-Outs and our Summer Reading Series helped adults learn about our faith and build their relationship with Jesus.
- After 10 seasons of Women of Grace, over 1,100 different women have engaged in prayer and community through speakers and events.
- The 10th year of That Man Is You focused on the theme "Worthy of the Call," helping men experience the power of transformation.

#### YOUNG ADULT MINISTRY

A young adult small group was formed and was quickly over capacity, indicating a desire and need for expanded young adult ministry. College Care Packages helped keep our college and trade school students connected to our parish.

#### STUDENT MINISTRY

- Led by a strong set of high school seniors and adults, about 40 high school students gained a deeper appreciation of what it means to live as disciples of Christ through Life Teen.
- Ten Core Team members served 47 middle school students who were inspired to grow in their relationship with Christ through EDGE and/or Emmaus Small Group.
- Seven middle school students served the local community through the Love Begins Here Mission and ten attended EDGE Summer Camp.

#### **CHILD MINISTRY**

- Child Ministry classes served 216 students in K3 through grade 5.
- Led by high school and adult small group leaders, Children's Liturgy of the Word offered kids the opportunity to listen to, understand, and discuss the readings with their peers.
- Stellar Vacation Bible School helped 99 children learn how to be Christ to others.
- From October to May, families were given resources to pray with and complete to help build knowledge and grow as disciples.
- Family nights were offered to begin and end the formation year, as well as Advent and Lent preparations and prayer focusing on the importance of family as the Domestic Church.



Six years ago, I answered the call to join the Life Teen Core Team. Even though I felt underqualified, stepping out in faith has been the greatest blessing. Our teens' love for Jesus and dedication to their faith, family, and school inspire me daily. I've also been fortunate to contribute to our parish's marketing efforts, which aligns perfectly with my graphic design background. I love collaborating with other passionate parishioners to make a positive impact. Plus, I joined a small group during Lent 3 years ago, and we still meet every other week to discuss the upcoming Gospel reading. #### **OUTREACH**

Lenten Outreach: More than 350 people served St. Agnes Parish in Butler during four project days. Child Ministry offered their annual Bake Sale in support of our Lenten Outreach.

Homebound Letters and Cards: An outpouring of love was shared with our homebound members through the gift of 400 cards and letters written by parishioners.

Collections: 151 holiday food boxes and 500 items for the food pantry were donated to Capuchin House of Peace. The Knights of Columbus Baby Items Drive, Dismas Jail Ministry Coat Drive, SVdP School Supplies Drive, and other food drives supported those in need served by local charities.

#### PASTORAL CARE

Called to Serve Ministry: This ministry invited parishioners to serve at local charities and parishioner homes during a Fall Yard Work Blitz. 120 participated.

Communion Visits: 37 home visits and 80 nursing home visits were made per week.


Bereavement: We launched Grief Share. a new 13-week bereavement series based upon Scripture.

**Farwell:** We said farewell to Mr. Francis Dempsey and announced the hiring of our new principal, Ms. Brita Willis.

**Enrollment 2023-2024:** We ended the year 423 Knights strong, graduated 39 of our students to be Knights for Christ in the world, and welcomed 47 new students from 35 new families.

**Learning Support:** A reading specialist was added to our support team.

ITBS and MAP Testing: On average, our students tested 2 1/2 grades above grade level.

**Spring Musical:** Under the direction of Music Teacher Christine White, the student cast and crew presented the musical, Disney's Moana Jr.

Knights Move Olympics: This major school fundraiser raised \$30,590.

**Athletics:** Over 900 children participated in St. Dominic sports teams and programs. Our 8th grade boys volleyball team was the Archdiocesan-wide Seton Tournament Champions. Way to go Knights!

**Tuition Assistance:** Generosity to this fund will help support 26 students with a St. Dominic Catholic School education, a 50% increase.

# Fiscal Year Financial Report

Year Ending June 30, 2024

#### **FINANCIAL NOTES**

FY24 was our first full year using Archdiocese Financial Norms modified Cash Basis Accounting. This means that all income and expenses are recognized as they occur without amortization spanning multiple fiscal years. The Operating Income surplus of \$59,314 reflects the following areas where our income exceeded budgeted expectations:

- Regular contributions and offertory gifts (in part from new parishioners)
- School tuition and fee income (higher school enrollment than budgeted)
- Interest income on cash assets and interest on investments Because we realized these very strong revenue streams, several Buildings & Grounds projects were recognized as operations expenses rather than tapping into our Long Term Capital Reserves. Finally, as noted last year, our Outreach collections are no longer recognized as St. Dominic income. You will note these funds are reported below the Operating Actuals and are not part of our budget.
