They challenge us to remember that Jesus always identified Himself with the lowly. As Edith Stein, Catholic convert and Saint who died in Auschwitz, was known for saying: "God is always on the side of the suffering."

Prayerfully review the following lists of the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. Think creatively: How can you bring Christ's love and mercy to the suffering this month by living out one or more of these actions?

Spiritual Works of Mercy

- Counsel the Doubtful
- Instruct the Ignorant
- Admonish the Sinner
- Comfort the Sorrowful
- Forgive Injuries
- Pray for the Living and the Dead
- Bear Wrongs Patiently

Corporal Works of Mercy

- Feed the Hungry
- Give Drink to the Thirsty
- Shelter the Homeless
- Visit the Sick
- Visit the Imprisoned
- Bury the Dead
- Give Alms to the Poor
