Discernment: Listening for God's Voice

Discernment is an important skill for following the Shepherd. It essentially means listening to the Holy Spirit for guidance with decision making. It's how we come to know what "God's will" is in any given situation. Below are some of the most common ways God speaks to us. Pay attention throughout your day to notice Him communicating with you in big and small ways. At the end of each day, thank Him for what you noticed and heard. Ask Him to show you when He was speaking that you missed. Continue building this habit of listening to God in every moment of your day. As you feel Him leading, work to follow Him no matter what.
