LIFE GROUPS



What are they?

Life Groups are ongoing small groups that are open to everyone. Life Groups meet weekly on Sunday mornings for the purpose of finding biblical community, studying God's Word, and forging meaningful relationships.

Why Life Groups?

Discipleship happens best in relationships. Relationships grow best in small groups. At Whitesburg, the first step to getting connected is to attend a Life Group.

We have groups for all ages and stages of life. Within each group, you'll find a welcoming environment with others excited to connect and get to know you. Each class uses biblical curriculum to launch relevant discussions and formulate practical applications of God's Word.

DISCIPLESHIP GROUPS

(D-GROUPS)

What is a D-Group?

A D-Group is a gender-specific, closed group of 3-5 believers who meet weekly for 6-12 months for accelerated spiritual transformation. Each group meets for approximately one hour each week to pray together, read and study Scripture, and walk through accountability questions.

What is the commitment?

- Meet weekly for 6-12 months
- Give yourself fully to the Lord during this time as you anticipate a season of accelerated spiritual transformation
- Commit to the five weekly disciplines (Bible Reading, H.E.A.R. Journals, Scripture Memory, Accountability, and Prayer)
- Discuss your Bible Reading Journals and prayer requests
- Contribute to a group atmosphere of confidentiality, honesty, and transparency
- Pray weekly for fellow D-Group members and those in your life who don't know Jesus
- Pray and look for those in your life whom you could invite into your new D-Group once your current group multiplies

Why D-Groups?

Jesus' entire earthly ministry illustrates the importance and necessity of close fellowship with a small group of believers. While Jesus called 12 disciples, Scripture reveals that He specifically spent more time with three of them.

1. D-Groups are relational.

D-Groups are small, including no more than 4-5 individuals of the same gender. In this way, our D-Groups become a highly-focused and highly-relational huddle of spiritual growth.

2. D-Groups are replicable.

What Jesus modeled with the disciples led to the greatest spread of the gospel the world has ever known! Using Jesus' ministry as a template, D-Groups commit to go and do as Jesus commanded. At the conclusion of each D-Group semester, members gather more disciples and start again, thus becoming disciples making disciples.

Who are D-Groups for?

Believers who have made a profession of faith to follow Christ are encouraged to join a D-Group. Our recommendation is to connect in a Life Group and join a D-Group with those whom you get to know.

What is "I Serve"?

Our Mission Strategy is founded on the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20) and is summarized in the following three statements: I SERVE, AS I GO, and GO TEAMS. We are committed to spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ, living on-mission, and serving others. The statement "I SERVE" means that every member is called to edify the church by using their God-given talents to build up the body of Christ (Ephesians 4:12). We are committed to helping people find the place that God is calling them to serve.

Where can I serve?

Whether you are gifted musically, have a desire to teach the Word of God in a group, have years of experience in corporate America, or have no idea where to serve at Whitesburg, we have a place where you can glorify God with your gifts.

With our goal to reach 1,000 people with the gospel, we want to prepare our church to welcome many first-time guests who come through our doors.



Parking Team

Our parking lot greeters show guests how excited we are to gather for worship and fellowship on Sunday mornings! They also help people find available parking spaces and the entrances to our Main Campus. This

is the area of service with the greatest need for new volunteers.



Drivers

Our Golf Cart drivers provide convenient transportation from where people are parked to the entrance of our church. Shuttles run from 7:30 am to 12:30 pm and provide transportation to and from

the South Campus, dropping people off at the North and South Lobbies.

Greeters

Our greeters help people feel welcome as they come into our church, escorting people to the Worship Center and to Life Groups. Our greeters express the culture of our church to newcomers and become the first opportunity for visitors to find friendship at WBC.



Ushers

We have a great need for leaders in the next generation to step into this vital role. Men (and their spouses) who serve as ushers help with greeting people as they enter the Worship Center, handing out information to people as they enter, taking attendance in

worship, and helping guests find their seats. They also begin building relationships with the members and guests they are seated with.

AS I GO

We are a going people. Every day, Whitesburg members go to work, go to the gym, go to lunch, go to ballgames, go to practice, go to meetings, go to the hair salon, and on and on we go. What if our reason for going was actually for something greater than what we imagined? What if we lived like every place we go is an opportunity to share the grace and truth of the gospel with our world?

In Acts 1:8, Jesus tells His disciples that when the Holy Spirit comes upon them, they are to be His witnesses in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and to the ends of the earth. Today, as we follow Christ, we are to be His witnesses in our neighborhoods, our city, our state, our country, and to the world. As we go, we are to be faithful witnesses of Jesus Christ!

GO TEAMS

What are Go Teams?

Go Teams are short-term mission opportunities for our church members. These teams are committed to sharing the gospel, praying for the work, encouraging mission partners, and serving. While Go Teams are short (typically a week or less), they bring enthusiasm, energy, encouragement, and create opportunities for gospel impact.

Why Go Teams?

In Mark 6:34, Jesus looked out on the crowds and felt compassion for them. Jesus said they were "like sheep without a shepherd." Two thousand years later, the crowds have gotten bigger, but the burden is the same. Over 50% of the world's population lives amongst unreached peoples, and our goal is to reach as many people as we can with the gospel of Christ.

Who can participate in Go Teams?

Every person in our church can have a role on a Go Team! We recognize that college students have been an integral part of missions for many years. Their impact on missions is vital, and the impact missions has on college students is equally powerful.

LEADERSHIP PIPELINE

Exploring Service and Servant Leadership at Whitesburg

What is it?

Our church is comprised of many people who have vast experience in various fields and who desire to use their abilities for ministry and service in the church. The purpose of the Leadership Pipeline is to provide opportunities for the Pastoral staff and church leaders to meet new members and identify the next generation of leaders at Whitesburg. Our desire is to cultivate deeper relationships and broaden the disciple-making process by introducing them to service and servant leadership principles. These principles will help participants lead themselves, lead their families, and lead others in ministry.

Why a Leadership Pipeline?

The church functions best when members use their Godgiven gifts for His service in the church. Paul teaches in 1 Corinthians 12:12, "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ." He goes on to say in Ephesians 4:11-16, "And He gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ." From this we can see that Jesus' desire is that people would lead in the church from a wide background of experience.

Whitesburg has enjoyed the blessing of being served by many committed, faithful people from its inception. But as the church has aged, the enlistment and training of next generation leaders has not kept pace with the ministry needs of the church.

Who is the Leadership Pipeline for?

The criteria for those interested in participating in the Leadership Pipeline are:

- A participant must have a clear testimony of saving faith in Jesus
- A participant must be engaged in the life of Whitesburg through active participation in a Life Group
- A participant must be serving some place in the church (we can help participants find that place of service)



How do I get involved?

Leadership Pipeline participants:

Interested people will complete a brief application, available at WhitesburgBaptist.org/Leadership.

- Applicants will be contacted for a personal interview
- The interview will give greater clarity to the following ministry criteria:
 - 1. Candidate's personal testimony of saving faith and baptism
 - 2. Candidate's involvement in Life Group/D-Group
 - 3. Discover areas where the candidate is serving
 - 4. Spiritual gifts assessment

After the interview, the candidate will be assigned to a leadership mentor.

- The leadership mentor and paticipant will meet regularly for accountability, review assignments, and to discuss the lessons until the curriculum is complete.
- Every person who contacts us will be assigned a place of service/ministry within their areas of interest and ability.






MAIN CAMPUS
