❖ **The Conscious Mind**

Conscious is defined as:

❖ **Breakdown of the Conscious Mind Functions:**

1. **Awareness & Perception** –
what allows us to be aware of our surroundings, including sights, sounds, and other sensory input. It's how we understand and interpret what is happening around us.
2. **Reasoning & Logic** –
enables us to think logically, analyze information, and make decisions.
3. **Self-Awareness** –
allows us to be aware of ourselves as individuals separate from the external world and to understand our own thoughts, feelings, and experiences.
4. **Voluntary Control** –
we use our conscious mind to control our voluntary actions, like speaking, walking, or making choices.
5. **Memory Retrieval** –
it plays a role in retrieving information from our memory, both short-term and long-term.
6. **Language Processing** –
The conscious mind is essential for understanding and using language.
7. **Goal Setting** –
Helps us to set goals, plan our actions, and work towards achieving them.
8. **Imagination & Creativity** –
conscious mind is involved in imagination and creative thinking, allowing us to generate new ideas and possibilities

❖ The Subconscious Mind

Subconscious is defined as:

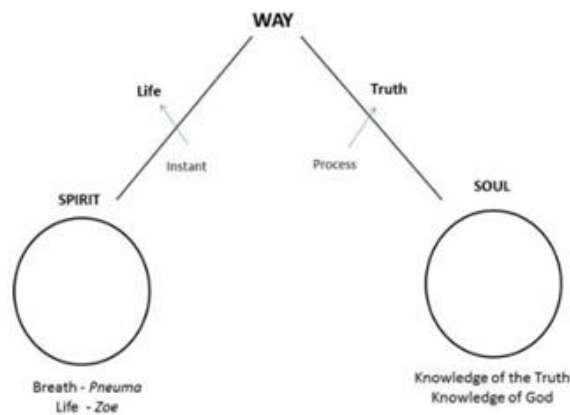

Interlinear Definition:

Transformed – G3339 *metamorphoō* – To change into another form, to transform, to transfigure from the inside.

When Jesus transfigured in Matthew 17 & Mark 9, according to Kenneth Wuest's Greek studies, it means that,

Do not be conformed to this world (this age), [fashioned after and adapted to its external, superficial customs], but be transformed (changed) by the [entire] renewal of your mind [by its new ideals and its new attitude], so that you may prove [for yourselves] what is the good and acceptable and perfect will of God, even the thing which is good and acceptable and perfect [in His sight for you].

Conformed – G49644 *syschēmatizō* – to conform one’s self (i.e. one’s mind and character) to another’s pattern, (fashion oneself according to)

Kenneth Wuest Greek Word Studies Reference:

This word in Rom. 12:2 is the translation of *sunscematizō* (συνσχεματίζω) which means “**to assume an outward expression that is patterned after something else, which outward expression does not come from within and is not representative of one’s inward nature, but which is assumed from without.**”

Paul is exhorting the saints not to assume an outward expression which is patterned after the world, which is assumed from without, and which does not come from nor is it representative of their inner renewed heart-life. In short, he exhorts them not to masquerade in the garments of the world.
