The Lampstand

Exodus 25:31-40 AMP

The Lampstand was made of pure gold – representing the purity or God's character

- A. There is a center shaft, with three branches on each side with flower like cups on each to almost look like a flower blooming.
- B. Holy anointing oil would be used to light, and then keep the lamp lit, representing the Holy Spirt as both the oil and the flame.
- C. The lamp served as a symbol of the Tree of Life
- D. The Lamp served as a symbol of illumination, joy, prosperity, guidance
