Purpose of Agency

The Ethnic Local Church Opportunities and Concerns Convener serve to strengthen and support ethnic local churches within the Baltimore-Washington Conference. Rooted in our call to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world, this ministry provides resources, connection, and collaboration in leadership development, worship, stewardship, small groups, and spiritual formation. Helping congregations build disciple-making systems that reach both the church and the wider community.

Current Goals

- Foster connection and collaboration among racial-ethnic ministries across the Conference.
- Provide resources and information on grants, training, and learning opportunities for local church leaders.
- Support ministries through partnership with the Cross-Racial Cross-Cultural (CRCC).
- Host an annual gathering for education, fellowship, prayer, and advocacy.
- Encourage cross-cultural engagement and participation in Conference-wide initiatives such as A Diverse Church by Design, CCORR, BMCR, The Plan, CONAM, and the Korean Caucus.

Typical meeting dates: place (Zoom or in-person), time, and number of meetings per year.

- **Format:** Zoom or in-person, as determined by the Convener.
- **Frequency:** Typically, 2–3 meetings per year, including one annual gathering.
- Time: Scheduled based on member availability.

What does serving on the board involve? What responsibilities and activities will members carry out?

Board members will:

- Participate in meetings and discussions that advance the work of racial-ethnic ministries.
- Assist in planning and facilitating the annual gathering.
- Share information, resources, and opportunities within their ministry networks.
- Pray for and engage in ministry that strengthens the presence and witness of ethnic local churches throughout the Conference.
