Why (Mission)

What

How

We foster a culture of innovation and renewal by:

- **Resourcing and coaching** visionary leaders and ministry teams who are called to start new faith communities or revitalize existing ones.
- **Investing in places and populations** where the Spirit is opening doors for creative ministry, evangelism, and transformation.
- Collaborating with local churches, districts, and conference staff to cultivate a
 pipeline of new expressions and renewed congregations rooted in contextual
 discernment, prayer, and strategic action.
- Supporting congregational revitalization efforts through tools, training, and partnerships that help churches rediscover their mission, engage their communities, and grow in discipleship.
- Measuring fruitfulness through discipleship, community impact, sustainability, and spiritual vitality.

Together, we are cultivating a movement of faithful movement makers and devoted stewards—both planting new seeds and reviving deep roots—so that the Church may grow more diverse, more nimble, and more faithful in its witness to the Good News.

The Board members help cast vision and dream dreams related to starting new faith communities and revitalizing existing congregations. Board members have the opportunity to receive training in congregational development, redevelopment and Fresh Expressions.
