Youth Cookie Fundraiser

Things conference in San Antonio. These conferences are a great experience for the youth and something they look forward to every year. And just to ensure that the cookies are of the highest quality, I hereby pledge to be at church on Saturday the 11th when the cookies are being baked to enforce strict quality control measures.

Lent

Ash Wednesday is February 22nd. Please plan to attend this service and take advantage of all the Wednesday midweek services, and especially Holy Week services in March. Lent is such an important season of the Church Year, where we break from the routine and focus on repentance and fasting. There is wisdom to celebrating while the bridegroom is present (Mark 2:19) but also in setting aside good things for a time to focus our attention and then to increase our joy when the fast is over.

This year our Lenten theme is: Honest Repentance. It is a series of doctrinal sermons on the nature of repentance. "The sermons employ themes and imagery of biblical texts to elucidate doctrinal topics." They are written by seminary professor, Rev. Dr. David Maxwell. David was studying at the sem when I was there and I got to know him a little then, but he went on to get a PhD from Notre Dame in patristics (you get extra credit if you know what this means without having to look it up!) Professor Maxwell was also the main presenter at last year's Theological Symposium at which he gave the opening presentation and the concluding sermon. He spoke about the early church and their way of reading the Bible —a topic that could have easily been, let's say, a little dry. But Dave absolutely crushed it! He had us hanging on his every word. I was thoroughly impressed and so I am looking forward to going through this sermon series with you.





Lutheran High School of Kansas City, Concert and Visit

On Sunday March 12, we are privileged to host the traveling band, choir, and bell choir from Lutheran High School in Kansas City. More details will be forthcoming, but mark your calendars and if you have a spare bedroom, please consider opening your homes to host a few high school students that night. As both a high school and college student, I went on choir tours and stayed in a lot of homes. I really enjoyed the experience of getting to meet a lot of Lutherans at different churches all across the country. I hope we can

provide a great experience for these youth and that it will in turn be a blessing for us as well.

Another thing to consider is that this (opening your home to guests) is a chance to practice hospitality. Scripture speaks of the love of strangers this way: "Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality" (Romans 12:13) In Greek the word here is philoxenia -the literal opposite of a xenophobe! The word is used one other time in this strange and memorable passage: "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares." (Hebrews 13:2)

Debt Retirement

You will be hearing more about this in the coming days. But for now, if you are one of the many people who have made extra offerings toward this, then with all sincerity: thank you very much. If you have been meaning to get in on this and want to help retire the debt, then the time is at hand. There are special offering envelopes in the narthex and you can specify on any offering that you want to designate it for the "Building Fund" or "debt reduction" and we will see that it goes where it needs to. Don't hold me to this, but I think we currently owe just a little over \$50k. Not bad considering when I started here 10 years ago, we owed \$1.2 million. God has certainly blessed us with many people who are willing and able to support generously.



The Blessing of God

As we continue moving into 2023 I thought I would share a devotional from Tom Groelsema that I found online. I have been reflecting on God's blessings to me and thought it also applies to all of us.

Numbers 6:22-27

²² The LORD said to Moses, ²³ "Tell Aaron and his sons, 'This is how you are to bless the Israelites. Say to them:

²⁴ "'"The LORD bless you and keep you;

²⁵ the LORD make his face shine on you and be gracious to you;

²⁶ the LORD turn his face toward you and give you peace."

²⁷ "So they will put my name on the Israelites, and I will bless them."

Today Christians all over the world will gather to worship God. Many will receive a closing blessing in worship through the words that Aaron and his sons spoke over Israel: "The Lord bless you and keep you..."

What is this blessing that God puts on us? First, we receive the blessing of God's protection and keeping. This is something we need in the wilderness of life. Life is full of trials, heat, hunger, and death. How good it is to hear God say that he will keep us! Second, we receive the blessing of God's pardon. Another way of saying that God's face shines on us is to say that his face lights up with delight. This is true because of Jesus. His face shines on us in grace. Third, we receive the blessing of God's peace. When our face is turned away from someone else, it is often a sign of tension. But when our face is turned toward another, it is a sign of peace. God's blessing on us is that his face will be turned in our direction so that we will know peace with him.

We must remember that these are not wishes but *blessings*. In other words, they are true for us because of Christ. In Jesus Christ, we are kept, forgiven, and restored to peace with God.

Receive and believe his blessings today!

Luke 6:38

Give, and it will be given to you. Good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For with the measure you use it will be measured back to you."

Along this same line, we as a congregation have a historic moment before us. Last year, your church leaders challenged all of us in a concentrated push to retire our mortgage. You have stepped up and our cup runneth over. We have reduced almost \$100,000 of the debt and are very close to being mortgage free. We have been blessed by God and we are able to pass these blessings on to others. I am truly grateful to be a part of such a kind, caring and generous congregation.
