## Thank the Lord our building debt is paid!

On Sunday, April 23, it was announced to the congregation that at long last, our mortgage is paid! ... Well, it *almost* is. We currently owe less than one monthly payment which will be paid soon, but we wanted everyone to know that the debt is covered and it is no longer necessary to contribute anything over and above to "Debt Reduction" or the "Building Fund." (If you are interested in contributing over and above, please consider giving to our "Scholarship Fund" —more on that below.) Many thanks are due to so many people who sacrificed and contributed to this effort, and most of all, we give thanks to God for His providence and granting us the means to retire this debt. We will formally celebrate this milestone on Pentecost Sunday, May 28 with one worship service at 10:00 AM followed by a fellowship meal.

## What's next for Lord of Life?

A previous generation of leaders at Lord of Life planned for the building and expansion of our facilities. They had plans to build an even bigger sanctuary and more classrooms in phases 3 and 4 of the master plan. (You can see the architect's drawing depicting what this might look like still hanging in our Conference Room.) Since that plan and drawing was made, the landscape in Plano has changed. Other LCMS churches were built close by, and while our city has grown tremendously over the years, many of the newer residents do not come from a Christian background as can be seen by the presence of Mosques and Hindu temples. Also, as we all know too well, our world is increasingly secular and many people are sadly uninterested in religion. For these reasons, the current leadership is uninterested in taking on an even bigger debt and building out phases 3 and 4. The facilities we have now are more than suitable for our needs and we think our resources should be directed elsewhere. But where exactly? Should we add more staff? Increase the number of programs we offer? Remodel and update our current facilities? Increase our support of missions? Focus more on evangelism in the community? Etc. etc.

### **CADDS**

The Administrative Council is considering these questions about our future and we are using some tools provided by the LCMS to help us. We also need your help. This month, we are encouraging all our members to participate in an online survey called the **Congregational Assessment of Development/Decline Status (CADDS)**. The synod describes this as a self-assessment tool designed to help our congregation to answer the question "Where are we ... really?" The tool measures three things: sustainability (do we have the means to continue and if so for how long), adaptability (how open are we to change?), and the third measurement determines our balance between outward and inward focus. The survey consists of 95 questions and takes about 20 minutes to complete. Your responses are completely anonymous. No one will know your name, and I will not see individual responses. When the results are analyzed, we will receive a simple report aimed to help identify our stage of development or decline and what factors are contributing to our status. It will

give us some ideas about what things we are doing well and what we could do better. It will also recommend further steps to take such as strategic planning for the future and evangelism resources. Unlike expensive consultants and programs, this service is provided by the LCMS completely free of charge. For several years our scholarships helped Nick and his family as he prepared for this. What a blessing to see a son of our congregation enter the Office of the Holy Ministry!

God has indeed blessed us tremendously and we will celebrate these blessing and rejoice in them!

Here are some of the benefits of donating to the scholarship fund:



**Thank you** that she conveys your patience in her listening, assisting, and encouraging.


**Thank you** that she sacrifices her body to serve my well-being after the example of Your Son.
