- Hello Church! It's Stewardship time...and for the first time in many years I say that with a heart full of joy. God's grace and mercy has surrounded St. Andrew this past year in amazing ways! Your giving, your faith, your sacrifice, your joy, your presence, your talents have all been multiplied to put this church on a new path. In 2023, we withdrew over \$150,000 from our reserves to stay afloat. At that rate our reserves and church would have been gone by 2027. Through much sacrifice, we sought alternative sources of revenue and have narrowed the gap in our budget. We took risks and met the test God put in front of us, stepping forward in faith while never ceasing to serve our community and neighbors. In 2025 we withdrew only \$40,000 from reserves. Seeing that, I realize we are in striking distance of balancing our budget. Maybe not in 2026, but perhaps within the next few years. With that said we are embarking on a three year journey to close that gap! The theme of our giving will be to "Mind the Gap" as they say in the London underground. The most direct way you can Mind the Gap is through your giving. You have been a generous congregation through our struggles and I know you will continue challenging yourselves to give more. But what if you are at the end of your rope financially...God's not done with you! Invite your friends, neighbors, and families to church! St. Andrew is growing and new visitors become new members. How about coming up with our next alternative revenue stream? It was during a group conversation about our struggles at the end of a Disciple bible study that Frank Hager uttered the magic words, "what about pickleball." Then came Family Promise. Then came Meals on Wheels. You may have an even bigger idea swirling in your mind! How can we use all of our land to better serve God's church? He has shown us His majesty and I firmly believe this is just the beginning of the next chapter at St. Andrew. Join me as we look forward to embracing and celebrating stewardship in the coming month!
