



Agency in Louisville, Kentucky. In addition to her role at Midway Hills, she serves as the Executive Director/Founder of Immigrant Justice Advocacy Movement.

Laurie's personal journey and passion for impacting missional justice issues started more than 27 years ago on her first mission trip to the Yucatan Peninsula where relationships with the people of the Yucatan pulled at her heart and mind. Since that time she has led 17 adult mission groups to challenge others to step out of their comfort zone and seek God.
