

Barbara Louise McNutt Merry. Graduating from William Woods College (now William Woods University), Fulton, Missouri, in 1961 with an Associate in Fine Arts in Applied Organ, Barbara studied organ with Fred Adams. From there she went to Henderson State Teachers College (now Henderson State University), Arkadelphia, Arkansas, to study organ with Robert Ellis and graduated in 1963 with a Bachelor of Music in Applied Organ.

Following graduation, Barbara taught band and orchestra in the Amarillo Public Schools in 1963-64 and served as organist at Forest Hills United Methodist Church. In 1964, she moved with her husband to Dallas,



Texas. Barbara and Jim have two daughters—Dianna Louise and Elizabeth Renee, five grandchildren, and two sons-in-law.

From 1964 to 1979, Barbara served as substitute organist, accompanist, handbell director, and children's choir director in churches in the Dallas metroplex and in Denison, Texas. It was during this period that she became actively associated with the Dallas Chapter of Choristers Guild.

From 1979, Barbara served Choristers Guild for nearly 30 years as administrator in various departments, including Shipping, Membership & Chapter Services, Accounts Receivable, Computer Systems, Website Maintenance, and Assistant to the Executive Director (Patty Evans). While at Choristers Guild, Barbara also served as organist at First Presbyterian Church in Garland, Texas, and later at Christ Community Church in Dallas, Texas.

She retired from Choristers Guild in 2008 and was awarded an Honorary Lifetime Membership. In February of 2009, Barbara took a part-time position as Administrator of the Church Music Institute, leaving time to devote to substitute organ work, handbell choirs, the Native Plant Society, and the North Texas PC Users Group.

Barbara has faithfully served Royal Lane Baptist Church as our Ministries Assistant for 14 years. She has managed our publications, calendaring, copyright declarations, and archives diligently over the years – in fact, if you mention anything you need, Barbara has a file for that! Her ability to jump in, learn, and master new programs was a gift to our ministry. Her constant presence in our office and her knowledge of information about the membership and people of Royal Lane will surely be missed.

We send her on into her next chapter with love and warm wishes.

### About "Farewell to Alleluia"

"Farewell to Alleluia" is a ceremony that may be used to dramatize the transition from the festive season of Epiphany into the penitential season of Lent and is most effective when paired with Transfiguration Sunday.

To provide even more impact, especially with children, a great deal may be made of hiding the Alleluia away for the Lenten season. "Alleluia" is our most joyful word, and because Lent is a time to be especially sad for our sins, we won't use this happy word again until Easter. On Easter "Alleluia" will be uncovered and carried into worship accompanied by a hymn featuring an abundance of "Alleluias."

The text of the antiphon used today in "Farewell to Alleluia" is translated from the Ambrosian Rite which developed in Milan in medieval times. The hymn text dates from the 11th century and was translated from the Latin by John Mason Neale. In our hymn today, it is paired with the tune PRAISE, MY SOUL (or LAUDA ANIMA) by 19th century English composer John Goss.
