(Please consider the opening sentences during gathering music.)

Today we enter the story of our beginnings - not just to recall what was, but to wonder together about what still might be. In the garden, God looked upon the first human and saw something missing. "It is not good," God said, "for the human to be alone." From the very beginning, God has seen our isolation - not just our solitude, but the ache for connection - and responded with presence, companionship, and creation.

When Adam first saw Eve, it was a beautiful, breath-catching moment. He didn't analyze or compare or withdraw. He exclaimed. He celebrated. "This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh!" He received her not as stranger, not as other, but as part of himself, as the piece he didn't know was missing, as kin in the deepest sense.

What if we were to receive one another like that? What if every person we met was seen not as rival or burden, but as flesh of our flesh? As someone bound to us by a sacred thread we can't always see—a part of us we don't yet know?

May our words and actions reflect your love,


and may we be instruments of peace,

Sermon

"At Last" Genesis 2:15-25

The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it. And the Lord God commanded the man, "You may freely eat of every tree of the garden; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die."

Then the Lord God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner." So out of the ground the Lord God formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called each living creature, that was its name. The man gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every animal of the field; but for the man there was not found a helper as his partner. So the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then he took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. And the rib that the Lord God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man. Then the man said,

"This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called Woman, for out of Man this one was taken."


Therefore a man leaves his father and his mother and clings to his wife, and they become one flesh. And the man and his wife were both naked, and were not ashamed.

RENOVATION UPDATE



We are excited to share that construction is officially underway on our Sanctuary Renovation project! Last week, the pews were carefully removed, disassembled, and stored, and the seat cushions were sent off for new foam and reupholstery. Our beautiful pipe organ has been sealed and covered for protection, and the grand piano is now safely relocated to Vickery Hall. Crews have started removing the water-damaged ceiling in the balcony, and over the next few weeks, the sanctuary will be sealed off as contractors begin removing the old asbestos flooring. The renovation will continue throughout the summer, with plans to joyfully unveil our refreshed sanctuary on Welcome Back Sunday, August 24.
