

Who among us hasn't felt tired, stretched thin, worn out from trying to keep up, to hold on, to stay awake in a world that moves so fast? And yet, the heart of this story is not the fall, it's what happens after.

Then Paul went upstairs, and after he had broken bread and eaten, he continued to converse with them until dawn; then he left. Meanwhile they had taken the boy away alive and were not a little comforted.

For the Word of God in Scripture, For the Word of God within us, For the Word of God among us, **Thanks be to God!** 


