We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home." And she prevailed upon us.

After leaving the prison they went to Lydia's home; and when they had seen and encouraged the brothers and sisters there, they departed.

For the Word of God in Scripture, For the Word of God within us, For the Word of God among us, **Thanks be to God!**



RENOVATION UPDATE







We're excited to share several meaningful updates as our Sanctuary Renovation continues! Construction is well underway on a new ADA-compliant ramp and sidewalk approach to the front of the sanctuary. This important addition will greatly enhance accessibility for individuals with mobility challenges and improve access and flow for all who use the front parking lot. Once complete, the area will be beautifully landscaped, and new signage is on the horizon as well.

Meanwhile, renovation work has also begun in our church library! The space is getting a fresh coat of paint, a new insulated ceiling, updated lighting, and comfortable new furniture. We're also adding a new "Welcome Center" in the office hallway to help improve traffic flow and make it easier for guests to navigate our campus.

And in especially exciting news, we've received a generous gift that allows us to complete construction on our sanctuary balcony and open it for congregant seating—adding valuable flexibility and capacity to our worship space. Our fully recovered pews have arrived and are being installed this week! With all these enhancements in progress, our timeline has been extended slightly, and we now plan to return to the sanctuary on Sunday, September 7. Thank you for your continued support and patience—we can't wait to welcome you back to a renewed, more accessible, and even more beautiful sanctuary!

On Sunday, September 7th, Royal Lane is one of several congregations hosting a Guns to Gardens event. In partnership with RAWTools and Presbyterian Faith Fellowship, this safe surrender event will be hosted at Episcopal Church of the Transfiguration from 2-5 pm. These unwanted guns will be dismantled by trained volunteers and the leftover parts will be forged into garden tools. As an incentive to gun owners, the collective will offer gift cards in varying amounts. To make a financial contribution towards this endeavor, please scan the QR code above.

Interested in helping? We need community members who will volunteer four to six hours. Volunteers should arrive on-site at noon for training. **Please register** to volunteer so we know all jobs will be covered and that volunteers can be trained.

Tasks required include:

Greeters (3) - welcome gun donor and ask them to stay in car throughout donation process; do not block driveways, assign to a Shepherd

Shepherds (12) - walk with gun owner through the donation and dismantling process, collect some anonymous survey information (TBD)

Gift Cards (5) - retrieve gift cards from our funding team, bring them out to the donors as a thank you gift

Hospitality (4) - help provide and serve water and refreshments to our volunteers throughout the event

Chop saw operator (3) - receive training in chop saw and angle grinder operation for the safe dismantling of firearms

Volunteers asked to arrive by 12:30pm.

Lydia of Acts, by Lisle Gwynn Garrity, acrylic on wood panel, inspired by Acts 16:11-15, 40

As the reach of the apostles expands, Paul, Silas, Timothy, and their companions make their way through Asia Minor to Europe, stopping briefly in Philippi, part of modern-day Greece. Since there may not have been an established synagogue in Philippi, on the Sabbath they find a prayer-house on the river, a space filled not with men and high priests, but women. They join them and as Paul speaks, one woman in particular—Lydia of Thyatira, a Gentile devoted to Jewish worship, a dealer of purple cloth—listens intently, her heart expanding with every word.

Despite her outsider status (Thyatira was part of Asia Minor) and how women are typically portrayed in scripture, Lydia is a woman of power, influence, and dignity. Purple dye was a luxury item for the elite, so we are to assume that Lydia is an established businesswoman. She is also, surprisingly, the leader of her household. After being stirred by Paul's message, she and "her household" are baptized. No patriarch is named—no man gets credit or gives permission. Lydia's first act as a new disciple is hospitality. She welcomes the apostles into her home (without the permission of a patriarch). Later, after Paul and Silas are released from prison, her large home becomes the meeting place for the apostles and the growing Christian community in Philippi.

As the only Philippian convert named in Acts, Lydia was quite possibly the leader and patron of the Philippian church. She used her wealth to establish the community, she risked her reputation as a businesswoman to house foreigners released from prison, she sanctified her conversion with acts of radical hospitality. In this image, I wanted her eyes to be the focal point. I hope they draw you in, radiating her warmth.
