(Please consider the opening sentences during gathering music.)

In the stillness of this hour, we remember Jacob at the river's edge a man caught in the night, wrestling with mystery, refusing to let go.

To struggle with God is also to struggle for God: for clarity, for blessing, for presence. It is to wrestle with the very name of God, with what we believe and what we doubt. with what we have lost and what we still hope for.

The struggle is not a sign of absence but of nearness. It is the grip of one who will not let go. It is the meeting place of wound and blessing. It is the place where we are named, and where we are changed.

As the music carries us into worship, may we dare to enter the struggle, to hold on through the long night, and to wait, expectant, for the dawn of God's blessing.

We come together in anticipation, seeking a face-to-face encounter with our Holy God.

Like Jacob at the river Jabbok, we find ourselves alone with God, wrestling with our fears and our doubts.

For when we wrestle with God and prevail, we are changed forever and given a new name.

God meets us in the unexpected and the wilderness. God holds onto us when we are weary.

So let us worship the Lord our God, with all our strength, our weakness, and our hope.

Let us pray:

Holy God, just as Jacob wrestled for a blessing and received it, we ask that You would bless us with Your presence and guidance. May we be transformed through these encounters with You, so that we may become a greater blessing to others and point them to the faith of Jesus Christ, in whose name, we pray. Amen.

Genesis 32:22-32

The same night he got up and took his two wives, his two maids, and his eleven children, and crossed the ford of the Jabbok. He took them and sent them across the stream, and likewise everything that he had. Jacob was left alone; and a man wrestled with him until daybreak. When the man saw that he did not prevail against Jacob, he struck him on the hip socket; and Jacob's hip was put out of joint as he wrestled with him. Then he said, "Let me go, for the day is breaking." But Jacob said, "I will not let you go, unless you bless me." So he said to him, "What is your name?" And he said, "Jacob." Then the man said, "You shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with humans, and have prevailed." Then Jacob asked him, "Please tell me your name." But he said, "Why is it that you ask my name?" And there he blessed him. So Jacob called the place Peniel, saying, "For I have seen God face to face, and yet my life is preserved." The sun rose upon him as he passed Penuel, limping because of his hip. Therefore to this day the Israelites do not eat the thigh muscle that is on the hip socket, because he struck Jacob on the hip socket at the thigh muscle.
