

Members of Royal Lane Baptist Church, what is your responsibility and commitment?




Family Dedication

Luke 1:5-13

In the days of King Herod of Judea, there was a priest named Zechariah, who belonged to the priestly order of Abijah. His wife was a descendant of Aaron, and her name was Elizabeth. Both of them were righteous before God, living blamelessly according to all the commandments and regulations of the Lord. But they had no children, because Elizabeth was barren, and both were getting on in years. Once when he was serving as priest before God and his section was on duty, he was chosen by lot, according to the custom of the priesthood, to enter the sanctuary of the Lord and offer incense. In the Time of Herod's Reign

Advent I (Luke 1:5-13)

In the time of Herod's reign, Zechariah knew despair; past his prime, all hope seemed vain, stuck in fear without a prayer; then amid his temple task, God broke through his world of doom: "You, though jaded, scared to ask, by your faith, new life shall bloom."

Advent II (Matthew 11:1-11)

John, who preached, "Prepare the way", found his hope was slim to none; longing for redemption's day, asked of Christ, "Are you the One?" Jesus answered in reply: "Sick are healed, and dead are raised"; may we hopelessness defy; by God's deeds to be amazed.

Advent III (Luke 1:26-39)

Gabriel to Mary spoke: "Do not be afraid", he said; unknown myst'ries still evoke insecurity and dread; though her doubt and fear were strong, stepped she forward to her call; may we, when our world goes wrong, through our fear, still risk our all.

Advent IV (Matthew 1:18-25)

By God's Spirit, she conceived; Joseph pondered through his fear, threat'ning all he had believed, options feeling all but clear; then an angel, in his sleep, soothed, and said, "Please take my hand - do not fear; now take the leap; name him Jesus. I command."

Christmas Eve/Day (Luke 2:1-20)
