

President of Hudson Link for Higher Education in Prison

Sean Pica is the President of Hudson Link for Higher Education in Prison and Vice President of New Beginnings Transitional Housing, a not-for-profit organization that provides college education, life skills and re-entry support to incarcerated and formerly incarcerated men and women to help them make a positive impact on their own lives, their families and communities.

Mr. Pica has presided over Hudson Link's growth in size and scope. Since taking over leadership of the organization in 2007, it has grown from 60 students attending Mercy College at Sing Sing Correctional Facility, to more than 580 students attending college prep, and college programs in 5 New York State Correctional Facilities. Partnering with Columbia University; Columbia Greene, Mercy University, Mount Saint Mary, SUNY Ulster, Hudson Link has awarded over 2000 college degrees. In addition, Hudson Link is now actively involved in the very important work of providing re-entry support, including transitional housing, to its more than 3000 released alumni to help them successfully transition back into their families and communities. Before joining Hudson Link, Mr. Pica served on its Board of Directors.

Mr. Pica serves on the Governors New York State Council on Community Re-Entry and Reintegration, is a founding Board Member and serves as the Advisory Board Chair for the national Alliance for Higher Education in Prison, and serves on the Board of Directors for the New York State Consortium for Higher Education in Prison, and the Sing Sing Prison Museum Project.

RPC Mission and Outreach invites you to celebrate Mother's Day and Father's Day with new parents at Open Door by participating in our 9th Annual Open Door Baby Bundle Project. Open Door midwives deliver over 400 babies a year. The majority of their patients live at or below the federal poverty level. They struggle with inadequate housing, food insecurity, low health literacy, and cultural/language barriers.

Even under the best circumstances, the birth of a new baby can be overwhelming. Then consider the stress of living in poverty and not being able to provide the most basic necessities for your child. The Baby Bundle, supported only through donations, provides Open Door prenatal patients with basic newborn essentials: diapers, wipes, onesies, hats, mittens, socks, bibs, a thermometer, and seasonal clothes.

The support through Open Door doesn't stop with Baby Bundles. All women who deliver their babies with Open Door are supported by a Patient Advocate who provides prenatal information, postnatal support, nutrition and wellness guidance, and access to insurance benefits.

The entire Baby Bundle can be purchased for \$200 per newborn. Bassinets are in the hall outside the first-floor Welcome Area and the entrance to RPNS. During our month-long drive, we invite you place your donations in the pack-n-plays. Additionally, you can order items to be sent directly to Open Door through the Amazon Open Door Baby Registry. We'll be exploring “*The Surpassing Value of Knowing Christ: A Study of Philippians*,” co-authored by Beth Moore and Melissa Moore. Throughout the summer, we'll meet across five consecutive weeks for 90-minute sessions in the church library, in-person only. This study includes workbook homework, live discussion, and a weekly viewing of Beth Moore's teaching videos together. If this is your introduction to Beth Moore, you're in for a treat! She's a decades-long Bible teacher and speaker based in Houston, TX, whose studies are full of humor, life-application, and intensive research on Scripture. Moore writes: “The book of Philippians is exhortation driven by unabashed affection. Discover how you can be unstoppable in love, faith and good works even amidst frustration and opposition.”
