

And so it is with September in our world, and not just on the highways, but in every facet of our lives. My old-school write-in calendar goes from a week that just says "vacation," to days chock-full.

As we dive into a new program year and school year, we all have decisions to make. We can't do everything, but where should we put our energies, time, and resources? On World Communion Sunday, we celebrate that Christ's peace extends throughout all creation. Whenever the church gathers for worship, we are assured of Christ's peace. As a community of faith, we want to deepen our commitment to peacemaking so that it becomes a visible and profound witness to our community.


RPC Women's Discipleship Group

Confirmation 2026

Does science fit with what is taught in church? What is God really like? If God is so good... why do bad things happen?

This month, the Confirmation class of 2026 will begin its exploration of these questions and many more, as together we explore the bible story and the life of faith. As a ninth grader, you may not be asking these questions out loud (or at all!) - or eager to take on some extra work as high school begins. Yet the Confirmation process – no matter your decision at the end of the year - is a unique opportunity to explore the life of faith at this important point in your life journey.

Music Notes

Offer Your Musical Gifts in Worship This New Program Year

As we begin a new program year, please consider how you might add your musical gifts and abilities as an offering in worship. Details about specific singing groups (Chancel Choir, Children's Choir, and Music Makers) are printed elsewhere. But what about your skills as an instrumentalist (I'm thinking of a number of youth and young adults)? Please let me know; trust, and fear not!

Two Major Works to Be Offered by the Chancel Choir This Season Consider Singing in the Choir for One or Both

The Chancel Choir will present two major works within the next four months. The first will be in worship on Sunday, November 2, with an offering of the Requiem, op. 9, by Maurice Duruflé (1902-1986). Duruflé, the long-time organist of the Church of St. Etienne-du-Mont in Paris (in the Latin Quarter, somewhat behind and to the north of the Pantheon), wrote this masterpiece in 1947 to the memory of his father. Scored originally for full orchestra (with a minor organ part), Duruflé wisely created an organ-only reduction: it is this version we will offer, with Larry Allen (a great friend, and a colleague from my Hartford days) at the organ. The melodic material is based on the Gregorian chants associated with the Requiem texts. This is music that will complement well RPC's annual remembrance of those who departed this temporal life and now rejoice eternally in God's presence.

The second major work is the Gloria, RV 589, by Antonio Vivaldi. This will be offered in worship on December 14: the annual Cantata Sunday. An orchestra comprised of players from New York City's and the wider region's finest ensembles will join forces with the choir and soloists.

Our 2025-2026 Knock Intern in Sacred Music

Haniel Neves, an incoming student in the master's program at the Yale School of Music and the Institute of Sacred Music, will be our Peter B. Knock Intern in Sacred Music here for the 2025-2026 program year. Welcome, Haniel (pronounced "on yell")!

Mr. Neves, who hails from Spring, Texas, graduated in May from Trinity University in San Antonio, where he earned his Bachelor of Music in Organ Performance, along with studies in harpsichord, under Dr. David Heller. Haniel served various churches in San Antonio and was most recently organ scholar at St. Mark the Evangelist Catholic Church. He was awarded first prize and the hymn playing excellence award for the undergraduate division in the 2025 William C. ("Bill") Hall Organ Competition in San Antonio, and was the winner of the 2025 Trinity Concerto Competition.

The comprehensive nature of the internship, particularly the opportunities presented to grow as a choral conductor, caused Haniel to inquire. He stated that a brief video (thanks to Cari Pattison, Charles Park, and Max Crawley), provided additional inspiration.

The Peter B. Knock Intern in Sacred Music is an outgrowth of the Peter B. Knock Scholarship, an award that was given from 1991 to 2016 to promising organists whose career path was leading them to work in the field of sacred music.


