He Qi is a prolific Chinese-American artist who rigorously studies Scripture and vibrantly reinterprets the Christian tradition. *He Is Risen* depicts a distinctly contemporary imagining of Easter morning in Matthew's Gospel, where the women come to the tomb just at the break of dawn to grieve their Lord and friend Jesus. Instead of a dead body, they encounter the angel bearing good news: "He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said." He Qi is currently an Artist-in-Residence at Fuller Theological Seminary (CA) and a Distinguished Visiting Professor at the Art Institute of RUC (Renmin University of China.)
