#### The Presentation of the Lord



#### REFLECT

#### THE PEOPLE OF GOD'S KINGDOM

In our Gospel reading from Matthew, we hear the Beatitudes, the stirring opening to the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus is proclaiming the coming of the kingdom of God, and begins by considering what kind of people will enter and participate in this kingdom. They are the poor in spirit, the meek, the clean of heart, the peacemakers. We hear both Zephaniah and Paul echo this, as God specifically chooses the weak and the lowly to be God's agents in ushering in the reign of God. By living with humility and integrity, their hearts are open to being transformed by the grace of God. We too are called to live in this way. Jesus invites us to be people with open hearts, to receive God's blessing. And working through us, God may bless all of creation.

#### PONDER

Candlemas (February 2)

Thanks to Pope Sergius I (687-701), on February 2 we celebrate the Presentation of the Lord. On this day we also commemorate the Purification of Mary, who complied with the Jewish law (Leviticus 12:1). The law indicated that a mother should be purified forty days after giving birth to a boy child. Since the eleventh century the Purification of Mary and the Presentation of the Lord have been celebrated with the blessing of all the candles and candlesticks that are going to be used during the year. This is done with the hope that there will never be a lack of light, either material or spiritual, in the houses of the faithful. The root of the word candlemas is the Latin verb candere ("to shine") and from which also come the words candelabra and candlestick. This feast of candles recalls that Christians can, like Simon and the prophetess Anna in the temple, say that they also have seen salvation: Jesus the true Light who shines in the arms of Mary (Luke 2:25-38).

#### Concelebrant's Gestures

When more than one priest has vested to celebrate the same Mass, concelebrants use a series of gestures during the Eucharistic Prayer (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 216). When only the main celebrant prays aloud, the other priests fold their hands. When they all pray aloud together, they all extend their hands.

A little before the consecration, the main celebrant brings his hands together, palms down, and extends them over the offerings. Other concelebrants should make the same gesture from where they stand, using both hands. They are praying that the Holy Spirit will change the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ.

During the consecration, as the main celebrant holds the bread and then the chalice while repeating the words of Christ, concelebrants may extend their right hand toward these offerings. This unique gesture is probably intended as a way for the other priests to point. The gesture goes with "This"-as in "This is my Body." (Notitiae 1 [1965] 143, no. 34). To perform this action, concelebrants extend their right hand with the palm to the side, rather than down. This keeps the gesture distinct from the one made earlier with both hands.

The gesture during the consecration is made "if this seems appropriate," but almost all concelebrants use it. However, it is also acceptable for them to make no gesture at all. The concelebrants could just look at the altar while saying the words of consecration.

However the priests gesture, they help the people offer the Eucharistic Prayer. The change in gestures alerts the faithful to the development of the prayer from words of thanksgiving to words of petition, and into a sense of wonder as the Holy Spirit makes really present the Body and Blood of Christ.
