ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#1514-1515) teaches that this sacrament is not only for those at the point of death, but for anyone seriously ill or facing serious surgery. In fact, it is preferred that parishioners entering the hospital for surgery should ask the priest for this sacrament before being admitted. Parishioners should never wait until the last minute to call. We encourage parishioners facing surgery to let the parish priest know of their condition before entering the hospital so that they can be anointed before admission.

EXPLORING THE WORD

THUNDERBOLTS AND LIGHTNING

One of the most difficult duties of a disciple is to follow the command of Jesus to spread the gospel to all nations. (Lk 24:47, Mk 16:15, Mt 28:19) I think one reason may be that we don't feel we have the authority to tell someone else what to believe. Most of us don't think we know the gospel well enough to preach it. The gospel this Sunday mentions twice that Jesus taught with more authority than any of the religious leaders of Israel. So how can we get such authority?

First, Jesus didn't threaten people with thunderbolts and lightning. He certainly didn't impress people by saying what they wanted to hear. He spoke the truth that he heard from his Father. His two main actions in his ministry were curing and forgiving people. Since the Jews thought sickness was a punishment for sins, by curing the sick and forgiving sins, Jesus showed that he got authority from his Father.

How do we get that authority? We get it from the Holy Spirit, in Baptism and Confirmation. And like an athlete who has to work-out and practice to be any good, we still need to grow in that authority. One way is to read the scriptures and pray with them, so that we get to know God through his Word and begin to listen to him in our prayers. We can consciously decide to see God in other people, not just those we love, but everyone, even the ones who annoy us. And of course, the Eucharist and other sacraments strengthen God's life in us. You'll know you have that authority when you can talk about your faith with confidence instead of hesitation, because you will be speaking from experience, not second hand knowledge.

Incense

The smells of barbecue, fresh-baked bread, and evergreen arouse our noses. They also fill us with warmth and welcome. Smells enhance our worship as well. The wax of candles, the bouquet of wine, and the perfume of Chrism bring delight to Catholic faithful. But our most famous smell comes from incense. It signals the solemnity of our common prayer.

The occasions for incense range from the ordinary to the exalted. If we wanted, we could use incense every day of the year, but we generally reserve it for big occasions.

Several parts of the Mass call for incense. When the Entrance Procession forms, incense may lead the way. When the presider reaches the sanctuary, he may incense the Cross and altar in reverence. In the Gospel Procession, the deacon or priest may follow incense to the ambo, where he incenses the Book of the Gospels before reading. After the gifts come to the altar, the celebrant may incense the bread, the wine, the altar, and the Cross. Then a deacon or another minister may incense the priest and the people. When this happens, we stand up to receive the incensation. It's a stylized way of receiving the incense with the dignified humility of guests accepting a refill. During the Eucharistic Prayer, when the priest shows us the Lord's Body and Blood, a minister kneeling near the altar may incense this sacred banquet.

Other occasions invite incense too. At a funeral, we incense the remains of the faithful departed. At exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, we incense the monstrance. During solemn processions, incense takes the lead.

In the Scriptures, incense symbolizes prayer. Psalm 141:2 says, "Let my prayer be counted as incense before you." Revelation 8:3-4 says, "Another angel with a golden censer came and stood at the altar; he was given a great quantity of incense to offer with the prayers of all the saints on the golden altar that is before the throne. And the smoke of the incense, with the prayers of the saints, rose before God from the hand of the angel." Incense delights the eye as well as the nose. As smoke rises mysteriously to the heavens, it bears our prayers aloft.

Shepherd's Corner I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me

Beginning this week, our parish school (along with all other Catholic schools in the United States) is celebrating Catholic Schools Week. The theme this year is "Catholic Schools: United in Faith and Community." We are blessed to have Holy Trinity Catholic School (HTCS) as part of our parish. Many people have told the friars how impressed they are when the school hosts our weekend Masses and how eloquently the students proclaim the readings. I am personally humbled by their participation. I know many people find speaking before crowds unsettling, and these students do an outstanding job. For those who work with the students preparing them for Mass, thank you for your hard work.

But Sundays aren't the only time the school participates in our parish life. Many of our altar servers are members of HTCS. On the First Friday of the month, various classes attend our 8:30am daily Mass. They have also put their faith into action in our wider community, gifting area assisted living facilities with some of the arts and crafts they have made in school, thus assuring that they are not forgotten especially during the holidays. A BIG "thank you" to our parishioner and school principal, Mrs. Karen Ullman, for helping the students put their faith into action!

This coming week on February 3rd is the Memorial of St. Blaise, bishop, and martyr. After the vigil Mass on Saturday, February 3 and each Mass on Sunday, February 4, the friars and the Extra Ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion will be at stations around the church for the Blessing of the Throats. As we may recall from our youth, the tradition is that on the way to his martyrdom, St. Blaise passed a small boy choking on a fish bone, he stopped (not being concerned for himself and his impending death) and made the sign of the cross over the lad and the boy stopped choking. The early Church started to ask him to intercede to Christ for their healing, and today we continue that tradition.

In doing this ritual of the Church, we use two blessed candles (signifying Christ, the light of the world) tied together by a red ribbon (signifying the martyrdom of the bishop, Blaise). The blessing formula the Church uses is this: Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop, and martyr, may the Lord deliver you from every disease of the throat and every other illness. In the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

We need to remember that while the prayer we use in the blessing speaks of the ailments of the throat we don't simply refer to fish bones or sore throats; if we look at faith through today's culture, we also need to ask St. Blaise to help those of us who use our throats to promote slander or gossip. Perhaps we may need his intercession to curb language that is harsh or, as my mother would have said, "for those who have the mouth of a sailor," so that they may be healed of those vices. And some may even need his intercession for those who lie or talk back to parents. We need to remember God gave us voices to praise Him and to uplift one another. So, as we come forward to receive the blessing of the throats, we pray for all of the ways we need healing!


