ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#1514-1515) teaches that this sacrament is not only for those at the point of death, but for anyone seriously ill or facing serious surgery. In fact, it is preferred that parishioners entering the hospital for surgery should ask the priest for this sacrament before being admitted. Parishioners should never wait until the last minute to call. We encourage parishioners facing surgery to let the parish priest know of their condition before entering the hospital so that they can be anointed before admission.



<u>Easter</u>

On Eater Sunday, we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead. On this day, the disciples saw the empty tomb, and the Risen Christ began to appear to them. Easter celebrates our belief in life after death. It ranks first among the feasts of the church.

The Easter Sunday Mass differs a bit from others. The new Paschal candle is lighted and stands near the ambo. Having omitted the Glory to God throughout the season of Lent, we sing it again. The Easter sequence is said or sung after the Second Reading. During Lent, we sang a different acclamation before the Gospel, but now we again sing "Alleluia." In the United States, the Creed may be replaced with the Renewal of Baptismal Promises and the sprinkling of holy water on this day.

There are small changes to the Eucharistic Prayer. If you are alert, you will hear during the Preface that Christ became our paschal sacrifice "on this day." If the priest is using Eucharistic Prayer I, he announces that this is the day of the Resurrection of the Lord and that the community prays especially for those newly baptized at the Easter Vigil.

At the end of the Mass, the deacon or priest adds two "alleluias" to the words of dismissal, and you respond, "Thanks be to God, alleluia, alleluia."

Attendance is strong on Easter, as all those who profess faith in Christ join together in a single celebration. Many worshipers like to dress up for the occasion. The main Easter liturgy is the Easter Vigil on Saturday night, and all Catholics should make every effort to participate in it. But Easter Sunday remains a popular choice for affirming one's faith in the Risen Christ.

Shepherd's Corner

I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me

"My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" That's the Responsorial Psalm for today. I think many of us have uttered those (or similar) words depending on our life situations; times we've felt isolated, abandoned, or simply can't make sense of what's going on in our lives. So, we might ask, "Did Jesus feel abandoned by the Father as he hung on the cross?"

I remember reading that just as if we were saying, "Our Father who art in heaven." Most people could continue to finish that prayer because as little children we memorized it because of its importance in our faith. The same can be said for the psalms in Jesus' time. Like those prayers we memorized from childhood, the Jewish people would have memorized and internalized the psalms. Thus, when they heard Jesus begin the psalm, they too would have been able to finish it, like we could finish the "Our Father."

The Psalm Jesus is quoting is Psalm 22, so we need to look at the entirety of what Jesus is saying. The tone of the psalm changes as we move through it. It begins with thoughts or feelings of abandonment and then changes into a praise to God for his faithfulness to us. Jesus is showing us that even in our darkest times, when we may feel God is not with us, He does in fact care and listen to our prayer. It is in verse 25 we are reminded that God has not turned away from us but hears us when we cry out. What a wonderful gift Jesus gave us as he hung on the cross; this reminder that no matter the pain and sufferings we experience in this world, God really is there with us through it all.

During this coming week, we will be remembering much of what Jesus did for us. As much as I am an advocate for celebrating Christmas, this week is the holiest week of the Church year. We begin today with the reading of the Passion at our Palm Sunday Masses. As Holy Week winds down, we will celebrate the Institution of the Priesthood and the Eucharist at Mass on Holy Thursday. We continue on Good Friday with the stations of the cross and a Liturgy of the Word. (As an aside, Good Friday is the only day we do not celebrate Mass; it is a Liturgy of the Word and a communion service). Then the festivities begin on Holy Saturday with the Easter Vigil which is the greatest of all Church Liturgies.

I'd encourage you to try to make this week special by limiting or curtailing some of the activities that can draw us away from the wonders of God. As we approach Holy Week, let's reflect on the example Jesus gave us in recognizing that no matter what we are going through, God is always faithful to us.

PALM SUNDAY

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday. We wave our palms as a remembrance of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem. The palms were a symbol of victory and triumph. The people were celebrating Jesus as the fulfilment of God's promise of a Messiah.

A few days passed and the people turned on Jesus.

HOLY THURSDAY

On Holy Thursday we commemorate the Last Supper at which Jesus instituted both the Eucharist and the Priesthood. By example Jesus washes the feet of His apostles. It is through the washing of the feet that Jesus is teaching us to love and serve one another. Jn 13:15 "As I have done for you, you should also do."


GOOD FRIDAY

On Good Friday we commemorate the Crucifixion and death of Jesus Christ. This is a day of fasting and abstinence as we reflect on the sacrifice that Jesus made to conquer death. This is the only day of the year that Catholics do not celebrate any Masses.

HOLY SATURDAY

Holy Saturday is a day of solemn reflection and anticipation for the resurrection of Jesus. The Easter Vigil is the only Mass celebrated and is the greatest of all Church Liturgies. It begins with bonfire outside in which the Paschal Candle is lit. The Paschal Candle is then brought into the dark church. Everyone lights their candles from Paschal Candle symbolizing the light of Christ spreading throughout the darkness.






